Good Day My Beloved,

It's almost unbelievable to think that it is August already. This summer is flying by. It's been wonderful to see many of our families take well-deserved vacations this summer. As we return from our trips, let's get ready to dig in because we have a lot of things happening here at St. Paul's. I waited to finish my article until after the voter's meeting that was held after the 1030 service this past Sunday (29th). The vote was unanimous to start a praise service here at St. Paul's. Much conversation was had regarding this subject and the follow-on agenda items that needed to be discussed to enable this service. The overwhelming majority voted to have a Saturday evening service. There was a suggestion made to "demo" the service at both of our existing services so that our congregants will have an idea of what this service will look like. We hope to do this in October of this year. We pray that this service will start in early November of this year.

We will be offering the Praise service on the first, third, and fifth Saturday's of the month at either 5:00 or 6:00 PM. The money needed to accommodate this service (approximately \$2000) was also approved as we will begin to purchase this needed equipment. I am very excited about this service and what it could mean to our community. As we get this service in place, we will also be moving towards posting all of the sermons online and maybe someday a "live feed" to allow our shut-ins an opportunity to be a part of our worship services. This is the start of what I have been talking about regarding being ready to move as a congregation. We need to be there for our "family" here at St. Paul's but we also need to remind our neighbors that there is always room for the at God's Table. Outreach and stewardship are not defined by the actions that we confine to our property. If that were the case, the early church surely would have died. We need to be relevant to our family here at St. Paul's, but that needs to extend to the "mission field" as well. Jesus challenged us to go and make disciples of men … It's now time to act on that charge. Let us love our neighbors with the love that He modeled for us. Amen?



In America during the 1950's life had slowed down. However, for five young men who attended Wheaton College, life was about to change. With their dreams before them, **Nate Saint**, **Jim Elliot**, **Roger Youderian**, **Pete Fleming** and **Ed McCully** left college with a compelling vision to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ to those who had not heard it. Gripped with love for the Indian people of Ecuador, they left their comfortable lives in the states to live in the jungles of the Amazon. Joined by their wives, the couples established a successful ministry to the Indians. However, there was one tribe no missionary had been able to reach: the **Aucas**. The Aucas were known as brutal savages, who not only killed out-

siders, but also were involved with internal vendettas ending in the loss of many lives.

Armed with a love for others and a convict-

Ion to follow Christ's command to take the gospel to the ends of the earth, these five couples dared to reach the Aucas.
