Reformation is about uncluttering the church, and reclaiming its core so that the church can move forward to carry out its mission to the world. We aren't going back—we're headed forward. That's what resurrection is all about. Resurrection is about Jesus taking what is dead and giving it new life. What we do and how we do it will change. Jesus will continue to reform us. Jesus will continue to renew us. And Jesus will continue to bring what we thought was dead and bring it back to life—all for the sake of proclaim boldly God's Good News.

I look forward to proclaiming the Good News in new and inventive ways with you as we reach out to the Chambersburg Community. As we seek and find ways to connect with the people in the streets around us, with the local community. Community, Community, Community is our battle cry. Community in Christ! Community of Love!
