The regular monthly board meeting is held on the 2nd Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Village Hall. All meetings are open to the public.





Resident Notices:

The Village of Sheridan/Police Department has received complaints regarding dogs not being leashed within the village.

Village Ordinance requires pet owners to keep their pets leashed while on any public street, alley or sidewalk or other public place per Chapter 21-Animals of the *Municipal Code of Sheridan*.



The Village Board approved at their July 10th meeting to allow egg laying chickens within village limits with the following regulations:

- 15) A back yard chicken hen coop, pen, and up to 6 domesticated hens subject to the following conditions:
 - a) A hen coop is required and shall be between 4 square feet and 8 square feet.
 - b) Feed shall be contained within the coop and not scattered on the ground.
- c) Hens shall be contained in a fenced area with a fenced or enclosed top having an area not less than 32 square feet nor more than 200 square feet.
- d) The coop and pen shall be set back no less than 10 feet from any property line and kept in a clean, sanitary, and rodent free condition.
 - e) Electric service to enclosures shall not be provided by an extension cord.
 - f) Any coup and pen shall be sheltered from view by neighbors and from the street by a privacy fence.
- g) No hens shall be allowed that produce loud noise, disturb the peace, and cannot be contained within the coup and pen.
- h) No hens shall be slaughtered on the residential lot except for proper disposal of unproductive egg laying hens.
- i) No hens shall be kept absent a valid issued Village Chicken Permit. An application for a permit shall be available from the Village Clerk. The Village Marshall or designee shall perform an inspection of the site and the Village Clerk shall issue a permit if the property is in compliance with Village Rules. Permit fee shall be \$25.00.
- j) The Village Marshall may revoke a permit upon finding a site is in violation with Village Rules. Any action of the Village Marshall in approving or denying a permit may be appealed to the Village Board.

Reminders-Village Residents:

Village of Sheridan Golf Cart Ordinance:

No Golf Cart shall be operated on any sidewalk in the Village of Sheridan. No golf cart may be operated on a roadway in the Village unless, at a minimum, it has the following: brakes, a steering apparatus, tires, a rearview mirror, red reflectorized warning devices in the front and rear, a slow moving emblem on the rear of the golf cart, a headlight that emits a while light visible from a distance



of 500 feet to the front, a tail lamp that emits a red light visible from at least 100 feet from the rear, brake lights, turn signals, and a horn. When operated on a roadway, a golf cart shall have its headlight and tail lamps lighted as required by Section 12-201 of the Illinois Vehicle Code and its operator shall obey all Traffic Rules and Regulations as described in the Illinois Vehicle Code and Ordinances of the Village of Sheridan. Any minor child on a golf cart shall be seated in a forward facing seat and secured with a lap belt, seat belt of other form on safety restraint.

Zoning Ordinance for the Village of Sheridan-Swimming Pools (Chapter 6 Section C-13)

- 13. Outdoor swimming pools with water capacity height 24 inches or greater provided that it is maintained and protected as follows:
- A. Pool must be entirely fenced with a fence no less than 4 feet in height. The fence shall be of a type not to allow passage of an object greater than four (4) inches in diameter and not easily traversable or climbable by children.
- B. A side of a building may be used as part of the fenced enclosure so long as the resulting enclosure is entirely closed and protected from access by children. The wall of pool may be considered part of the fence so long as fence material extends above the water level or rim of the pool, no less than 1 foot.
 - C. A safety ring or pole must be located by the pool for rescue purposes.
- D. The gate allowing access to the pool must be self-latching and equipped with hardware for a locking devise to be used when the pool is not in use. In the event of no gate in the vicinity of the pool, it may be protected by a lockable ladder.
- E. Pool water must be filtered and maintained with clarity such that a black disc twelve (12) inches in diameter placed on the bottom of the pool is clearly visible from the side of the pool.
- F. A protective cover of sufficient strength and type to protect a child from the water shall be placed over any pool remaining erected over the non-swimming season.
- G. All outdoor swimming pools shall be constructed in a manner consistent with Article 680 of the 2002 Edition of the National Electrical Code with respect to technical requirements for the design, installation, wiring, and location of pools and pool components, including, but not limited to, pool filters, motors, and GFCI circuits.

The Sheridan Fire Department received an Ambulance Provider Support Grant for \$65,708.00, through the ARPA recently to help with the payroll for the department. The Department received a LUCAS device from the LaSalle County ARPA and purchase a 2nd one at a cost of \$19,000.00 so we now have a LUCAS Device on each ambulance. The new Life Pak Monitors should be arriving anytime that were ordered back in the Fall of 2022. These monitors will replace the 12 year old monitors that are outdated and can not be repaired, as we currently have a loaner from Stryker since a computer board went out of one of our current monitors. Both of these monitors cost the District about \$57,000 total with a 4 year maintenance plan after the warranty expires.

The UTV that the Sheridan and Serena Fire Districts purchased is fully operational at this time. It was a joint purchase where both departments will be using this for any emergency response needed along with any other department that may need it. This UTV is a wildland fire response UTV along with the ability to carry a patient if needed from an area where an ambulance can't get to.

The Fire District will be finalizing the updated specs for a new 2023 Horton Ambulance by the end of July. This new ambulance will cost approximately \$450,000. There is not much difference between the 2020 Horton we have now and the new one except the cost increase. We paid approximately \$315,000.00 for the 2020 Horton Ambulance. We can expect delivery in early 2025 for the new ambulance.

The Districts biggest challenge we are currently facing, is just like all other departments in the area: Shortage of help. We currently only have 12 members on the roster. We currently provide 24/7/365 coverage with ALL PART TIME help. We have no FULL-TIME positions and so far it has been working out for the District. We are currently working on the staffing situation to try and find new personnel that currently are FF/EMT Basics or Medics along with new Volunteers that want to become FF/EMTs. Our staffing currently has 2 FF/Paramedics, 2 FF/ Intermediates, 7 FF/Basics and 1 Volunteer FF on the roster.

The Fire Districts goal is to hire more staffing, whether it be all Part time or try to figure out the reality of going with Full-Time staffing. Full time staffing will be a large increase in payroll, insurance etc. Currently we have 2 staff ON DUTY at the station from 7 am to 7 pm, 24/7/365. Along with that we have 2 staff ON DUTY every night from 7 pm to 7 am. Staff that live in the Sheridan Fire District respond from their homes at night, all other staff that don't live in the Fire District stay at the station. Finding anyone to work anymore in any field is the biggest challenge for a lot of departments or businesses.


August 17th meeting will be given by Linda Floyd. She is sharing with us various herbs—she has been talking with Nancy from Redbud.
