On January 4, 1999, the Franklin caught fire and burned to the ground. Frank refused to take this lying down and immediately began drawing his own blueprint to rebuild. Without the help of an architect, Frank drew his own prints and had the Franklin rebuilt bigger and better than ever. Over his career, he owned businesses in Pigeon, Elkton, Caseville, and Bad Axe. He served over 25 years on the city council and a short time as mayor. Frank enjoyed fishing, hunting, playing cards, always looking for easy targets for a euchre game. Frank is survived by his wife of 60 years, Helen; son, Pat (Holly) Lerash, of Bad Axe; son, Paul (Cathy) Lerash, of Bad Axe; daughter, Lora (Dick) Humbarger, of St. Clair: daughter, Susan (Bruce) Smith, of Kalamazoo: several grandchildren, Frank, Amy, Tricia, Cheryl, Amber, Morgan, Al; and three greatgrandchildren; three sisters, Margaret Byarski and her husband, Karl, of Kinde, Rose Meagher, of Port Austin, Alice Gottschalk, of Kinde; and one brother, Edward Lerash, of Bad Axe.
