COLLABORATING ACROSS CULTURES

Michael Bandring's "Collaborating Across Cultures" by Jill Sheidaker The other day I happened upon a fascinating article about "cultural metacognition" and the research of Professor Roy Y. J. Chua, at the Organizational Behavior unit at Harvard Business School. My heart nearly skipped a beat when I learned that he and his team have been exploring the relationship between effective collaboration amongst people from different cultures and its ability to inspire innovation and creativity. We as interculturalists know that "Learning to work with people from other cultures in order to collaborate creatively is a vital skill in today's business environment," as said by Roy Y. J. Chua in the article. Beyond countless examples of blindness by companies created by a lack of intercultural awareness... and the historical accounts of when innovation was borne out of a clash of cultures - what other evidence do we have to show how intercultural collaborations can really add value to companies? Chua explores this question using a combination of surveys and experimental research focusing on "cultural metacognition" - a term that refers to a person's reflective thinking about his or her cultural assumptions. As I can in no way do justice to this 1,200 word article in this editorial, I encourage you to read it on HBS's Working Knowledge website, entitled "Collaborating Across Cultures" by Michael Bandring. It is definitely worth a read - both the article and the comments that follow.
