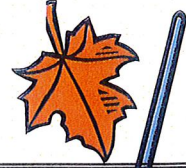

Thank you all for being patient during all the road construction in the Village. This summer the railroad fixed the railroad tracks, the NYS Dept. of Transportation has been working on 390 and the Village paved Rosencrans Street and the remainder of Park Avenue. Currently we are waiting for the NYS Dept. of Transportation's decision regarding speed limit changes on North Main Street and North Dansville Street. The Village Board requested the speed limits to be lowered to 30 mph within the Village. We are also waiting for the NYS DOT to paint the cross walks on Maple Avenue and the four corners. Still no report on the river clean up under the bridge and the bridge painting from the DOT. A meeting had been scheduled with Assemblyman Bill Nojoy to come look at and address matters. Sadly, we have lost a good Assemblyman who enjoyed coming to our community and working with us.

Winter is right around the corner, please remember that there is no parking on Village Streets, this includes State highways within the Village from 2:00 am to 6:00 am, November 1st thru April 1st.

Please find enclosed your semi-annual water bill. Payments should be made out to the Village of Cohocton, PO Box 330, Cohocton, NY 14826, or in person at the Village Office, 17 South Main Street, Cohocton. The office hours are Monday – Friday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Payments can be made online at www.villageofcohocton.com

A drop box is also available at all times for your convenience.

Payment without interest must be received in the Village Office, or postmarked no later than Monday, November 3, 2016. **Payments received November 4, 2016 thru December 5, 2016 must pay the 10% late amount shown on the bill.** All unpaid bills after December 5, 2016 will be subject to water shut off.

There will be **NO EXTENSIONS** granted after December 5, 2016. If payment arrangements need to be made, please call the Clerk's office at the time you receive your bill, **NOT** when the bill is due.

NYS MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATION

NEW YORK STATE REGULATION REGARDING MOTOR VEHICLES 302.8

*Effective October 2015

Except as provided for in other regulations, no inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicle shall be parked, kept or stored on a premises, and no vehicle shall at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled. Painting of vehicle is prohibited unless conducted inside an approved spray booth.

EXCEPTION

A vehicle of any type is permitted to undergo major overhaul, including body work, provided that such work is performed inside a structure or similarly enclosed area designed and approved for such purposes. Any questions, just call – 607-329-7842
