3rd Sunday of Easter - Year C 4th - 5th May 2019

First Reading: Acts 5:27-32, 40-41

We are witnesses of these words, and so is the Holy Spirit.

The high priest demanded an explanation of the apostles. 'We gave you a formal warning' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. By his own right hand God has now raised him up to be leader and saviour, to give repentance and forgiveness of sins through him to Israel. We are witnesses to all this, we and the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.' And they had the apostles called in, gave orders for them to be flogged, warned them not to speak in the name of Jesus and released them. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name.

Second Reading: Apoc 5:11-14

The Lamb that was sacrificed is worthy to be given power, wealth, glory, and blessing. In my vision, I, John, heard the sound of an immense number of angels gathered round the throne and the animals and the elders; there were ten thousand times ten thousand of them and thousands upon thousands, shouting, 'The Lamb that was sacrificed is worthy to be given power, riches, wisdom, strength, honour, glory and blessing'. Then I heard all the living things in creation - everything that lives in the air, and on the ground, and under the ground, and in the sea, crying, 'To the One who is sitting on the throne and to the Lamb, be all praise, honour, glory and power, for ever and ever'. And the four animals said, 'Amen'; and the elders prostrated themselves to worship.

The Word of the Lord

Gospel: John 21: 1-14

Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish.

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord,' Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER - Year C 4th - 5th May 2019

"Do You Love Me...Then Feed My Sheep."

In today's Gospel reading we are presented with a post - resurrection incident where Jesus reveals himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. Peter and some of the other disciples had met together, possibly despondent, still trying to come to grips with all that had gone before – the crucifixion of their Lord and master and their own failures in fidelity and the mission entrusted to them. The disciples have already been in the presence of the Risen Lord at least once; but uncertain of the future they take up their old life. "I'm going fishing". "We'll come with you." But despite their experience, they are unable to make a catch at the appropriate time.

Unexpectedly, Jesus steps in and stands on the shore at first unrecognised. He orders them to cast their net over the right side of the boat and immediately they make a very large catch which requires extra efforts to pull the net out which they are able to do. When Jesus invites them around a fire to share a meal of bread and fish he has prepared for them they have no doubt that this truly is their Lord and master - the heart of their community and whose mission they had been called to share.

The second half of the story is of great significance as through the conversation between Jesus and Peter we revisit the events of the passion when Peter, denied three times that he even knew Jesus. Now he is given the opportunity to be fully reconciled with his Master and to tell him that he does in deed love him. He is appointed by Jesus to lead his mission as a kind shepherd who knows and cares and would lay down his life for the flock that

has been entrusted to him.

Sometimes in life we find ourselves in the shoes of the disciples. Storms, difficulties and challenges in life, loss of trust in membership and church leadership and the mistreatment of peoples by the powerful and abuse of the vulnerable and the innocent can seriously test our faith. Today's gospel is a message of hope and reminds us to keep our eyes and hearts focused on the mission of Jesus – to draw all into the mercy and friendship of God. This comes in a life of prayer, respect and loving service to the poor the suffering and vulnerable of God's children. In them we will hear Jesus calling us from the shore.


