

A Promised Saviour

Read Genesis 3:15 and I Timothy 2:14-15

Eve was deceived and because of her yielding to the temptation she became a transgressor. Adam was not deceived. He knew he was sinning. His sin was deliberate. Note the two ways of sinning but both came under the same sentence of death for sin. The punishment for their sin is found in Genesis 2:17. The day spoken of here is one of God's days which equals a thousand years of our time, II Peter 3:8. Besides their life span being less than a thousand years, they were expelled from the Garden of Eden, Genesis 3:22-24.

Whatever kind of beast which talked to Eve, it is here called a serpent. There are various opinions as to the type of beast but whatever it may have looked like, Satan talked through it and because it was submissive to Satan, that species of beast was cursed by no longer being able to walk as before. The main part of the curse was not directed to the serpent, however, but to Satan in Genesis 3:15. Eve had allowed Satan to beguile her and therefore an enmity would be between the woman and Satan. The seed of the woman-the One to be born of woman, and by her alone without the concurrence of man, would bruise the head of Satan. Jesu's died to put away sin and to destroy him who has the power of death, that is Satan. Thus He bruises or crushes his head by destroying his power and lordship over mankind. Satan bruises the heel of the seed of woman through persecutions, temptations and trials. Certainly the suffering of Jesus in the Garden would fit this description. Luke 22:39-44. Through Eve being first in the transgression, she brought death upon herself, her husband and all her descendants. The female sex, though, along with the male shall be saved through child bearing. If Adam and Eve had not had children their race would have perished from the earth but by propagation their race was saved, also by woman bringing forth the Savior, both man and woman can be saved from the curse of the second death, if they live in faith, love and holiness.

This promised Redeemer of Genesis 3:15 could not be an ordinary person but must be one who was without sin or even the inclination to sin. Since the curse for sin was upon all the descendents of Adam, there was only one way to redeem the human race. Though God gave a law to Moses which allowed the offering of the blood of animals for a covering for sin, this could only cover for a season and could never blot out the sin, Hebrews 10:17. Therefore Jesus, one of the Tri-unity of the God-head became that sacrifice to forgive and blot out man's sin by His death on the cross. Romans 6:10; I Peter 2:24.

Jesus is part of the eternal God-head. From before the creation there has been unity between God the Father, God the Word (He is often called the Lord) and God the Holy Ghost. John 1:1-12. Throughout the Old Testament the One who was to become our Redeemer was the Messenger from God to man. In the Old Testament the word God often is used to include God, Jesus and the Holy Ghost (as we now name them). They are three separate persons, each with a job to do but working together in such a compound unity as to be one God. The title "Father" as given to God the Father is used to mean the leader or the head—in like manner as we call George Washington the father of our nation. Jesus was not the Son of God until He was incarnated by the Holy Ghost to be born of the virgin Mary, Luke 1:30-35. He then was called the Son of God, but note that it was the Holy Ghost who overshadowed Mary, not God the Father. Hebrews 7:1-3 calls Him Melchisedec—a priest of the most high God, without father, without mother, without descent, without beginning of days or end of life. Also read Genesis 14:18-20 and Hebrews 5:5-10.

Study for class discussion:

Numbers 20:7-13 I Corinthians 10:1-4 He was the Rock in the wilderness.

Joshua 5:1-4 He is Captain of the Lord's Host.


Isaiah 9:6 Names for the Messiah.

Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. ARTICLE VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. These common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers. Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9

Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly. A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teachings approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.



Soon three sleepy little heads were down, and Mom and Daddy could drink coffee, share, and talk about the dreams we had in the Lord. Such precious moments, when life seems so simple and God is so close and so real, when the phone isn't ringing, and the door is quiet, and you can say it's quiet now Lord, I'll listen. And He talks, and oh the sweet anticipation of what the week ahead will hold. If we had made a list then of what we wanted from Jesus, we would have probably said, "a safe trip, no car trouble, healthy kids, and a good camp." Oh how we undersell our Saviour. He had much more in store for us, and probably more, if we had only asked! Didn't He say ask and I will do it?

When a desire to accomplish an act is conceived in the mind the first requisite to the materialization will be power to produce. Obviously, such an important item could not be treated lightly by any right thinking person. Our dictionary defines power as the ability to accomplish an act.

In the 17th chapter of John 2nd verse Jesus said, as He prayed, speaking of Himself, "As thou hast given Him power over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as Thou hast given Him."

Paul said in all sincerity in Romans 1:16, "I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth: to the Jew first, and also to the Greek."

Peter backs these statements up when in I Peter 1:15, He speaks in effect, "We are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."

I am sure this is conclusive proof that we do not contain this power in ourselves so we must look for a source of that requisite. By the same verses we determine definitely that this source is from God. Following this line of thought we grasp readily that there must be adequate means of connection to this source if we are to derive any benefit of this necessary power.

Jesus spoke in parables that He might more thoroughly explain a truth to the people. Will you grant me the privilege?

Electricity is only an asset of energy when it is properly controlled. The power of God is always controlled by an omnipotent hand, therefore it is always an asset of energy. Electricity is only available for beneficial usage when the transmitting lines are intact and the connections firm. Again God's power is only available to you in a beneficial manner when your transmitting lines of faith and prayer are intact, and connected firm and sure to the throne.

When we moved to Taneyville, the Lord had so

blessed our lives that we had to rent the biggest truck to haul our worldly possessions. We had what we needed. God would supply our needs. And yet, hidden in the back of our minds was a little dark spot. You know the place I mean. That little box with a lock and chain that no one can look at, not even yourself. I decided if I talked fast enough I wouldn't hear God's voice that kept urging me to throw away the credit cards. I rationalized, we might need them sometime. What I was really saying was "God, you can't supply our needs, I need these little plastic gods, just in case you don't satisfy." The person you choose will represent your church and relate to the Board the views and feelings of their church.


