Teens typically model this behavior by being involved when they see their parents make faith and service a priority.
- 3. Participation in Events. We do a youth event each month. Since coming to UCBC, I am lucky if I can find enough adult leaders and/or transportation for the many who are eager to attend! Participating in events is critical for what we are trying to accomplish. I want students to feel a sense of belonging when they are with their church family. I want them to feel at home when they walk into the youth room. Participating in events allows them to gain a sense of belonging and to be known. The events are a time for teens to connect with one another and with leaders. When teens feel a sense of belonging in Christian community they are more likely to seek connection with Jesus. So please do everything you can to encourage your teen/s to come to events.
