Lucky Lotto winners play the numbers

Dad's winning strategy

A Michigan man won a \$7.19 million lottery jackpot after his dad suggested he try a new strategy. "I have been playing Lotto 47 for a long time, and would always switch up my numbers," the 38-year-old man said. "One day, my dad told me I should pick a set of numbers and stick with them, so that's what I did. I purchased an online subscription and have been playing the same set of numbers for a few years. A ticket he bought online matched the winning Lotto 47 numbers this past May. "I saw an email from the lottery saying I'd won a prize, so I logged into my lottery account, and that's when I saw \$7.19 million pending," the man said. "I was in total shock and instantly thought how my dad had been right." He recently visited Michigan Lottery headquarters and chose to receive his prize as a one-time lump sum of about \$4.9 million. The man, who chose to remain anonymous, said he plans to invest and put money into college funds for his children. "Winning feels surreal," he said. "It still hasn't sunk in that I'm a millionaire."

Luck strikes again

Winning the lottery appears to be becoming a tradition for one local family. Thomas Ensko won \$1 million on a Mega Millions ticket. He claimed his prize in June at the Massachusetts State Lottery headquarters in Dorchester.

It's a somewhat familiar routine. According to the Lottery Commission, Ensko's wife also won \$1 mil-

lion—more than 20 years ago, on an instant ticket. In a press release from MassLottery, Ensko said the numbers he chose are based on similarities to his birthdate. "I've been playing the same numbers for the last 20 years," he said. To win \$1 million, Ensko had to match all five numbers, but not the Mega Ball. He beat some pretty long odds—he had a 1 in 12,607,306 chance to get the five numbers correct. Ensko said he planned to use the money to help his children and grandchildren.

Lucky license plate


A Maryland woman has her license plate number to thank for a recent windfall. The 50-year-old woman, who has not been identified, told Maryland Lottery officials she originally disliked her tag number, 91104. At one time, she even requested for it to be changed—only to have her request denied. But after a few years with her license plate, she said she began seeing the number pop up in unusual places. "It kept appearing everywhere," she said. "I saw it on paperwork at my job, on other car tags, on TV, everywhere." She then began playing the numbers a few times a week, but she never imagined she would actually win. "I really never thought it would actually come out," she explained to lottery officials in an interview published on

the Maryland Lottery website. Then a recent \$1 Pick 5 ticket led to her winning \$50,000. Her husband checked the numbers, and, as a result, he was the one who delivered the news to his wife. "I just started crying," the winner said. Her husband shared that the win "could not have come at a better time" for them. They plan to use part of their winnings to pay bills and save the rest. News of the Maryland woman's win comes just a few months after a Maryland man made headlines for winning the Pick 5 lottery game three times in 11 months by playing the same number, 48548, each time.

County shares in casino revenue

The Little River Casino in Michigan, representing the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians, recently awarded \$700,301as part of a compact between state and tribal governments (the compact mandates that the board distribute 2% of the casino's electronic gaming profits as grants). These funds are designated to support public safety organizations, payments in lieu of taxes, and costs incurred by local governments. Beneficiaries include local public schools, West Shore Community College, Manistee County Council on Aging, Manistee Township, Manistee County Conservation District and the Manistee County Medical Care Facility. Since 1999, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has provided more than \$45.7 million to the board, according to a press release from the casino.

WVA gaming surge

The West Virginia online casino industry experienced a resurgence in May 2024, following a record-breaking March that saw approximately \$20.68 million in revenue. According to the West Virginia Lottery, online casinos in the state generated \$17.9 million in May, marking a slight 0.007% increase compared to the priLeading the charge was Hollywood Charles Town, affiliated with Draft-Kings Casino WV, which posted \$7.4 million in revenue. Close behind was Greenbrier, home to BetMGM and FanDuel, with \$6.4 million.

The origin story of **Bingo Loco**

Recently we reported on an unusual form of Bingo, Bingo Loco, an event that turns into a three-hour party complete with carefree dancing and nostalgic music. This month we dig a little deeper to find out how this unusual form of Bingo came to be, and what the events are actually like.

Bingo Loco's part-bingo, part-rave events are the brainchild of Irish co-founders Craig Reynolds, William Meara, and Stephen Lawless.

"Bingo is pretty big in Ireland, but it's very much for the retirement community," says Reynolds. "I would've went to a bingo hall when I was ten years old with my grandmother."

So, when the trio threw the first Bingo Loco party in Dublin seven years ago, it was no easy feat to convince their friends to show up. But in the end, "It was five, six hours long. Everyone was covered in sweat, there was confetti everywhere, and everyone was like 'That was the most fun I've ever had," recounts Reynolds. "Then we put up a video to see if there was any interest in doing a second one. It sold out in two minutes."

By 2019, Bingo Loco was the top-selling event in Ireland. The trio then took their bingo raves across the world. NYC is the home base for

Bingo Loco's US operation, which includes major hubs like Los Angeles and Chicago as well as smaller cities like Indianapolis and Corpus Christi. Internationally, you can find Bingo Loco in Australia, Dubai, and across the United Kingdom.

Held twice a month at The Brooklyn Monarch nightlife venue in Williamsburg, the parties offer New Yorkers light-hearted, wholesome entertainment sans any try-hard to be cool energy. Along with DJs playing throwback hits from the '70s to the early aughts, there's also a comedian host who calls out numbers for bingo cards and throws out challenges like lip sync and dance battles. Winners of the bingo rounds and challenges can go home with eclectic prizes from a trip to Las Vegas to a lawnmower.

"Funny enough, one thing we noticed [in the States] is people are having a great time just playing the bingo, never mind the party element," chuckles Reynolds. "Whereas back home, people are barely paying attention to their bingo books."

Seating is arranged in long, communal picnic-style tables to encourage mingling. Along with new friendships, true love has been forged over bingo cards with ABBA playing overhead. A couple who first met at a Bingo Loco party, even had a Bingo Loco pop-up at their wedding. If this sounds like your idea of a good time, then heed the words of Reynolds and "Leave your ego at the door."

year ... until the end of 2027. If any copays were paid going back to June 27, 2023, those costs will be reimbursed automatically.

The outpatient appointment has to be with a mental health professional at the VA or someone in the VA's approved network of community providers.

For new patients at the VA, the waiting times for appointments have decreased over the past year with primary care falling 11% percent and mental health visit wait times coming down 7%. That's quite an accomplishment, since last year the VA provided over 116 million health care visits. 1 million calls, up 15% over the previous year.

An important note: Any veteran in acute suicidal crisis can go to any health care facility for emergency care, whether it's a VA or non-VA facility. This rule has been in place since Jan. 17, 2023. The veteran is eligible for up to 30 days of inpatient care or up to 90 days of outpatient care. Being signed up in the VA health care system is not required, and there is no cost to the veteran.





Dear Upset,



Long-term care benefits for vets and their spouses

Dear Savvy Senior,

I hear that the Veterans Administration has a benefit that can help veterans and spouses with long-term care costs. We recently had to move my elderly father into an assisted living memory care facility, and my mother will probably need care too in the near future. What can you tell me? — Searching for Aid

Dear Searching,

The Veterans Administration (VA) does indeed have an underutilized benefit that can help wartime veterans and their surviving spouses pay for a variety of long-term care costs. This benefit, called "Aid and Attendance," is a special pension that's paid on top of existing VA pensions for eligible veterans and surviving spouses. In 2024, it pays a maximum of \$2,727 a month to married veterans; \$2,300 a month to single veterans; or \$1,478 a month to a surviving spouse. The money is tax free, and can be used to pay for assisted living, memory care, nursing home or in-home care services.

Currently, around 156,000 veter-

ans and survivors are receiving the Aid and Attendance benefit, but many thousands more are eligible who either don't know about it or don't think they qualify.

Eligibility Requirements

To qualify, your dad must have served at least 90 days of active military service with at least one day of service during a period of war, and not have been discharged dishonorably. Single surviving spouses of wartime vets are eligible if their marriage ended due to death.

In addition, your dad will also have to meet certain thresholds for medical and financial need to be eligible.

To qualify medically he must be either disabled, or over the age of 65 and need help performing basic everyday living tasks such as eating, bathing, dressing or going to the bathroom. Being blind or in a nursing home due to disability or receiving Social Security Disability or SSI also qualifies him. Single surviving spouses have no age restrictions, but they must require help with basic everyday living tasks to be eligible.

To qualify financially your parents "net worth," which includes assets and annual income combined, must be below \$155,356 in 2024.

To calculate this, add up your parent's assets, which includes their personal property (like investments, real estate, etc.) excluding their primary home and vehicles. And tally up their income over the past year (including Social Security, pensions, interest income from investments, annuities, etc.), minus any out-of-pocket medical expenses, prescription drugs, insurance premiums and long-term care costs over that same period of time. The VA also has a three-year

lookback to determine if your parents transferred any assets to ensure they would qualify for benefits.

How to Apply

To apply for Aid and Attendance, you'll need to fill out VA Form 21-2680 and mail it to the Pension Management Center (PMC) for your dad's state. You'll need to have your dad's doctor fill out the examination information section. Or you can also apply in person at a VA regional office near your parents.

If you need some help, you can appoint a Veteran Service Officer (VSO), a VA-accredited attorney or claims agent to represent your dad. See VA. gov/ogc/apps/accreditation/index.asp to locate someone.

If your dad is eligible, it can take months for his application to be processed, so be patient.

You should also know that if your dad's Aid and Attendance application is approved, the VA will send a lump sum retroactive payment covering the time from the day you filed the application until the day it was approved. Then your dad receives monthly payments going forward.

his most important vaccinations out of the way - to stay healthy outside or when encountering other dogs.

Here's a few great off-leash games:

Fetch: The gold standard game remains a favorite. Just grab a tennis ball and toss it.

Frisbee: Energetic dogs can chase these flying discs all day.

Agility training: Start with simple tasks like going under or over obstacles.

Swimming: Fill a kiddie pool in the backyard and let your dog splash around on a hot day.

Tracking: Have your dog follow a line of treats to a "jackpot" (a toy or food). Extend the distance between treats each session.

Remember, only take your dog off leash in a safe area or approved offleash location. A fenced-in backyard is ideal, but if you don't have one of those, go to a dog park or a park that has an off-leash area. Some of these games, like agility and tracking, can be done on-leash. Have fun!





Gambling for your entire net worth

Let's analyze the iconic poker hand from the final scene of the movie Rounders, where Teddy KGB and Mike McDermott battle in a high-stakes heads-up poker game for Mike's net worth.

Playing a \$50/\$100 heads-up no-limit Hold 'em cash game with \$27,000 effective stacks, Mike raised to \$200 from the small blind with 9s-8s.

Note that in this hand, the big blind is also the button and acts last on all betting rounds. This is the opposite of the structure of heads-up poker today.

Since Mike will be out of position, he should use a tight preflop strategy. When you are 270 big blinds deep, it will be difficult to play out of position, especially if your opponent is overly aggressive, as Teddy clearly is. I do not like Mike's min-raise because it essentially forces Teddy to continue with his entire range due to getting amazing pot odds and position.

Teddy called Mike's preflop raise. The flop came 10h-7s-6d. Mike checked with his straight.

When Mike flops the nuts, his goal should be to get as much money into the pot as possible. If Mike had no reads on Teddy, he should make a continuation bet of \$300 into the \$400 pot, which guarantees the pot grows while also concealing Mike's range (assuming he intends to continuation bet a large chunk of the time). Betting may also induce a bluff-raise from Teddy, getting a ton of money into the pot.

Teddy bet \$2,000 into the \$400 pot. Seeing how Teddy bet five times the size of the pot, Mike's check was brilliant. Teddy's range is almost certainly polarized, meaning he has either a premium hand, such as a straight or three of a kind, or a draw,

such as Ah-9h and 5-4. Since Mike has Teddy either drawing dead or thin, he should call to induce bluffs on the turn and river. When a wild player is applying immense pressure, the last thing you want to do is raise and let their bluffs off the hook.

Mike called. The turn was the 2c. Mike checked.

Mike definitely wants to let his maniacal opponent bluff again.

Teddy bet \$4,400 into the \$4,400 pot.

When Teddy bets the size of the pot on the turn, he is likely still polarized to a strong made hand or a junky draw, most likely a 9, 8, or 5-4. Since Mike still has that range crushed, he does not need to raise for value or protection. Unless he is confident that Teddy actually has a premium hand, he should call and give Teddy a river bluffing opportunity.

Mike called. The river was the As. Mike checked. Teddy went all-in for \$20,400 into the \$13,200 pot.

The rivered ace is an interesting card because it improves one of Mike's most likely bluff catchers, A-A, into a much stronger bluff catcher. When Teddy uses a gigantic all-in bet size, his range should be either the nut straight, a set or a bluff. With two pair, Teddy should probably bet a bit smaller, \$12,200 into the \$13,200 pot, so marginal made hands can call.

Facing the all-in, if Mike had K-K, Q-Q or J-J, he should probably make an optimistic call because he beats almost all of the missed straight draws. He loses to A-9 and A-8, but those hands would probably check behind or bet smaller. So, all – or almost all – of Teddy's bluffs lose to J-J. Since Mike thought Teddy would be willing to run a big bluff, he should call down with all of his bluff catchers. Perhaps the worst hand he should call with is J-10, although calling with even weaker pairs could be ideal.

Mike called \$20,400 with the nuts, doubling his net worth.

"Pay that man. Pay that man his money."






