• Communication to Residents

We are going to start posting on the website notes from the Supervisor, such as things that are going on outside of the board, things happening in the community, things the supervisor is involved in, get this information out to the community as soon as possible without waiting for approval from the board. If you know something is going on and you think it should be communicated to the public let Overhiser know so he can get it on the website. He would also like to enhance our synopsis that goes in the paper, this would be communication from the board.

• Truck Route Request

Jeffrey Wilson and Dale Morgan whom both live on 72nd Street, between Baseline and North Shore, both sent emails to Overhisers attention stressing their concerns about the increase commercial truck traffic between the two roads mentioned. With Menard's here, and a gravel pit in the area, has created a lot of commercial traffic on this stretch off 72nd. In correspondence with the Allegan County Road Commission, Jeff Wilson was told that this stretch of 72nd St. was eligible to become a "No Truck Route" which is accomplished thru a joint effort between Casco Township and Allegan County Road Commission. Thru research Overhiser found out the Townhip would have to pass an Ordinance and that would empower the State Police or whomever to process tickets if trucks continue to use this road. A sign would be posted as to a "No Truck Route".

Van Buren County is okay with making their portion of this road area a "No Truck Route". Allan would propose to Van Buren County, starting with the stop sign on 71st ½ to 72nd Ave. between Baseline and North Shore.

• Miami Park Property Purchase

Overhiser was approached by a realtor, Nick Stegman, representing the property owner next to our parcel #008-00 wanting to purchase this parcel. This individual owns parcel 012-00 and parcel 001-00

which are on either side of our parcel. The township has owned this parcel since 2002. What we have done in the past is advertise the parcel for sale in the paper asking for bids, these parcels are on the east side of Miami Park. Allan made motion to put this parcel up for bids by advertising in the paper and also possibly on our website.

• Allegan County Emergency Plan Process

A year a go the township went to their meetings, they hired a consultant to come in, they didn't get very good participation, they are trying to get this plan going again. They are trying to get the townships interest again, Overhiser and Brandan Hinz, Fire Chief, sat thru a zoom meeting with a consultant trying to get a Emergency Plan for Allegan County.
