“I never met a man I didn’t like.” Will Rogers said that. I can believe he said it, but I have a more difficult time believing he meant it. I don’t think he lied. I just find it hard to believe there could be a person who never disliked anyone. Loving is something different, although there are many people who talk as if liking and loving are interchangeable. They love ice cream or country music, and they like their friends. One can love, that is, behave in a loving manner, without positive feelings. You couldn’t say that about liking, but about loving you can. Some folks say one of the reasons you should love others and do good for people is because of the good feeling you get when you help someone. The problem

with this is that when you no longer get a good feeling, you stop doing the good things. But as disciples of Jesus, love we must. It’s different than liking. It seems to me the most difficult people to love today are the anonymous souls, the people we don’t know—the immigrant coming to our land, the person of another religion who prays differently, or those living a lifestyle foreign to us. Jesus didn’t have a problem with loving people like them. ●

Dear Padre,

Do saints ever smile? That question comes to me every year on the feast of All Saints (November 1) as I look at the pictures and statues in church. The faces are so somber and serious. What are the saints really like?

Artists through the centuries may have portrayed sanctity in very subdued tones. The saints, however, and their biographers tell a different story. The holy men and women who make up the communion of saints are an incredibly fascinating array of diverse personalities. The feast of All Saints celebrates our universal call to holiness. Our challenge is to imitate the characteristics these unique individuals have in common.

Saint Irenaeus (125–202) said that the glory of God is the human fully alive which reflects Jesus’ own words, “I came so that they may have life; and have it more abundantly” (John 10:10). Saints enjoy life! The nearsighted St. Alphonsus Liguori (1696–1787), founder of the Redemptorists, sat in the back row of the Naples theater with his glasses off so he could enjoy the music he loved without the distraction of the half-naked chorus line. Saint Teresa of Ávila (1515–1582), caught devouring partridge in the convent kitchen, said, “When I pray, I pray; when I eat partridge, I eat partridge!” Saint Joan of Arc (1412–1431) loved horses, and St. Charles Borromeo (1538–1584) loved chess. Indeed, saints do smile. They even laugh. ●

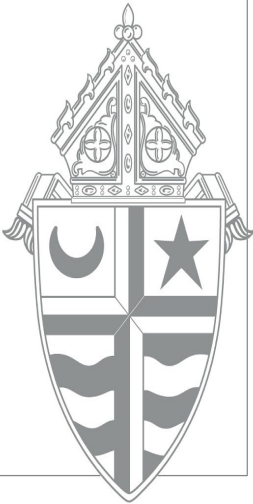

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION SCHOOL FAMILIES FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS

- Registration:** The registration fee is per student, per school year. If your child is removed and re-enrolled, a registration fee will be charged again. Early: on or before May 23, 2024 \$125.00 Regular: May 24-July 31, 2024 \$150.00 Late: on or after August 1, 2024 \$175.00.
- Church Offering/Catholic Cost:** Catholics - Immaculate Conception School is a non-tuition school, because under the direction of the diocese, Bishop McKnight believes the education of the parish children is a mission of that parish. Therefore the children of the parish may attend the school because their parents are supporting the mission of the church by educating them (the child) in the ways of the faith. There is no tuition as long as the parents are ACTIVE PARISHIONERS. An active parishioner is a person who TITHES faithfully and justly to the church and PARTICIPATES in the sacramental and community life of the parish. We hope that you WILL tithe justly and faithfully as we educate the children of our parish while supporting the mission of the parish.
- Non-Parishioner Cost:** Non - Catholics 2024-2025 school year: \$3900 for one child, \$5,335 for two children, and \$5,885 for three or children.
- Technology Fee:** \$50.00 per child with a max of \$150 per family for the school year.
- Milk:** Milk for the school year will be charge at \$30.00 per child per semester or \$60.00 per child for the entire school year. Any extra milk will be \$0.35 per milk. All students are required to purchase milk unless a written doctor’s note states otherwise. This is because the school participates in the Federal Milk program.
- Copy of Records:** Current vaccination, copy of Birth Certificate and social Security card for all new students, copy of Baptism and First Communion certificates for all new students or those recently baptized or communed. Copy of Divorce paper with custody statement for divorced parents.
- Extended Care Fees:** \$10 for the first child, \$8 for each additional child 6:30-7:15am and 3:35-5:30pm, fees include before and/or after school (or any part thereof). Example: 2 children = \$18 3 or more children =\$24 *\$15 per child on early out days, \$12 for additional child: Example: 2 children = 27, 3 children = \$39 *\$30 for a full day *All students: if your child is in our care after 5:30pm, you will be charged \$1 for every minute after 5:30pm.
