Dear friends, welcome to the 28th Sunday in ordinary time- the second Day of the Lord in October. Let us make the effort to grow spiritually as we pray the beautiful prayer of the Rosary as we seek Mary's intercession for an end of the Covid -19 pandemic as well as other ailments and hardships in life.

In the gospel Reading of this Sunday, Jesus continues to teach us about the kingdom of his Father to which we are all destined. Jesus likens it to a Wedding banquet the king prepares for his son yet many of the invited guests find reason to stay away.

God had sent a series of prophets to invite his people to the banquet. Many of the prophets were mistreated and some killed like John the Baptist. Jesus directs this parable to the chosen people of the house of Israel- where few responded to the call. Jesus points out the defiance of the chief priests and the leaders of the nation of Israel.

The King continues to send out invitations to all people including gentiles who come and fill the hall. The King notices among the guests one who made no attempt to be clean and well dressed. His clothes were completely inappropriate for the wedding or banquet. The king orders this man to be thrown out-where there is suffering and pain.

Like the message of last Sunday in the parable of the tenants, the new tenants have the duty of producing the fruits of the kingdom to the satisfaction of the land-owner- God.

Living by the Spirit requires one to truly pray, listen and respond with faith to God's invitation to holiness. This journey of spiritual growth and maturity a life call invitation. May we continue to grow as we seek God in prayer. Have a great week.
