The Katahdin Club will be sponsoring a Pointing Breed Judging Seminar on March 8 at the Kittery Trading Post. This seminar should be of interest to all members because: (1) a number of the Hunt Test rules will be changing as of January 1, 2008 – every person who participates in Hunt Tests should be up to date on the new rules; and (2) the AKC has changed its requirements for Hunt Test judges – after January 1, 2008, all judges must complete a seminar within 5 years to remain current, and all those applying for new judging certification must complete a seminar before they are allowed to apprentice. A copy of the seminar announcement is enclosed in this newsletter. This is a full day seminar, including lunch for \$45/ More specifics are also given on the club web site at katahdingsp.org. 
