CARETAKER'S CORNER

I hope these small steps help maintain a property that looks good for everyone to enjoy and be proud of.

YARD WASTE BIN is conveniently located next to the storage lot for lot clean-up. This bin is put in place for you to dispose of yard waste such as leaves, limbs, plant clippings, etc. We kindly ask that you do not dispose of any other debris in this YARD WASTE BIN. No plastic or household garbage.

COMMUNITY YARD WASTE BIN is often located near the fire department and we ask that you use this when possible during the time it is in place.

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE DUMPSTERS are put in place for HOUSEHOLD WASTE ONLY. These dumpsters are not to dispose of any furnishings like indoor/ outdoor furniture, carpets and rugs, mattresses, appliances, etc.

RECYCLING – Is encouraged and appreciated. Start a recycling pool with your nearby neighbors to make fewer trips to the facility.

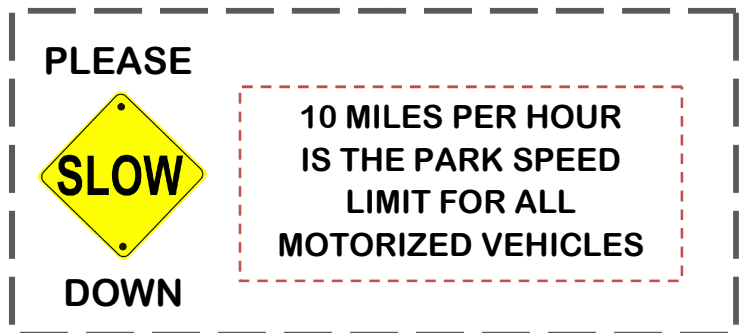


Tips for Off Road Drivers

Having fun on off-road trails or getting a demanding job done are high priorities when using an Off Road Vehicle (ORV), but safety should always be the highest priority. Much of the potential danger of riding can be mitigated by undertaking proper UTV/ATV safety training, making sure your off-road vehicle (ORV) is in good working order, and taking the appropriate safety precautions. Your safety, and the safety of those around you, is paramount. Learn the ropes, stay cognizant of the riding situation and conditions at all times, and, of course, have fun!

- Wear Protective Off-road Gear
- Inspection of Your Off-Road Vehicle
- Understand the Controls & Parts
- Learn to Ride Safely
- Understand the Types of Terrain You Are Riding
- Know How to Sit Correctly on/in an ATV or UTV



What to Avoid

- Driving Too Fast - Resisting the urge to drive at excessive speeds throughout every ride are one of the most important components of safety. At high speeds, you have less control, and obstacles appear in your path with much less warning. Turns are more difficult to execute, ruts and potholes pack a much bigger punch, and momentum can more easily get the better of you. Drive at comfortable speeds to allow you and your group to enjoy the riding experience.
- Not Knowing the Laws & Regulations - Always be aware of the ORV rules and regulations for a given location. These laws are not only meant to protect you, other users, and the environment: They also help protect that the ability to off-road will be allowed to continue in a particular place. Ignoring regulations can get yourself or somebody else hurt, land yourself a nasty fine, and potentially impede riding opportunities for others in that area.
