Pastor David Sands Writes . . .

As many of you know, Norman Johnson passed away on March 19th. His passing is dominating my thoughts as I write this article, and the thought that strikes me as the most significant is this. Life is a cycle, more precisely a series of cycles, much like the cycles of weather we have been experiencing lately. Some days we have felt that Spring has arrived, and then Winter would return. For Norman, his health went through several cycles of crisis and recovery, and now he has completed the cycle of his earthly life. He was born, grew to be a man, got married, raised a family, and now has exited this life to start another life, which through his faith, will be in the presence of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Also, this is Holy Week, the period between Palm Sunday and Easter. The time we remember the completion of the earthly life of Jesus. He too was born and grew to be a man. He taught us many things about God and living according to the Father's will. He also died, but unlike Norman who slipped away peacefully, Jesus was abused, tortured, and suffered a cruel and agonizing death on Good Friday. Chimney Rock Congregational Council Minutes - March 18, 2024

Call to Order—Council President Randy Olson called the Wednesday, March 18, 2024 meeting to order at 6:30pm. Others present were Monica Dejno, Jerry Erickson, Richard Gunderson, Forrest Nutter (Memorial Secretary), Bev Paulsen, Pastor David Sands, Dan Solfest, Don Solfest, and Barb Sylla. Barb McGee was absent.

Devotions—Pastor Sands read from Mark, chapter 11, and discussion followed about Jesus not being the king people were expecting; Pastor Sands then led in prayer.

Secretary's Report was read by Barb S. Don and Forrest motioned to approve, and motion carried.

Treasurer's Report was distributed by Dan. Richard and Jerry motioned to approve; motion carried.

Business discussed:

- Chicken Dinner on April 28—After checking prices, Forrest has ordered the chicken directly from Pilgrim's at \$45 per case. He also applied for a debit card from Thrivent to help with dinner expenses, which we have received, as well as Thrivent T-shirts to wear the day of the dinner. Bush's in Augusta have donated beans, as they did last year. The beginning of April, Barb McGee and Barb Sylla will send advertising to area churches, WHTL, and area newspapers; posters will be placed in area businesses. They will also contact workers for setup on April 27 and the dinner on April 28. They will be ordering and picking up supplies (chips, buns, paper products, water) as well.
- 2) **New Member**—the Council approved a recent transfer of membership for Kris Flury from Osseo Evangelical to Chimney Rock.
- 3) **Reimbursement**—the Council will reimburse Pastor Sands and Monica for children's sermon supplies.
- 4) Ministry Team Contracts were signed by Pastor Sands and Monica and will be placed on file. The term is from March 1 through December 31, 2024. Beginning in 2025, the contracts will run from January 1 through December 31, the calendar year.
- 5) Rostered Leader and SAM Reports are due.
