This will be a membership class for those who want to join the church, but for those who are already members or for those who are not interested in joining the church, this will be a refresher class, or maybe a just getting to know more class. It will be geared for our younger learners in middle school and high school, but everyone will be welcomed. Specific dates and times will be announced after we get the schedules from interested people.

GOALS FOR 2019

Communication -

By March 1, 2019 100% of all committees/groups will appoint a recorder to relay the information from their meetings to the office within 3 working days highlighting items for sharing with the church family. (using our newsletter, bulletin, email etc.).

De Clutter -

- We will de-clutter 12 areas of the church, one each month during 2019.
- We will make a group to work on each area based on peoples use of the area and willingness to help.
- We will start with the balcony, then boiler & custodian rooms, then the nursery. The other areas will be added in the following months.

Capital Fund -

Establish a Capital Fund to be used to cover the costs of current and future RUPC building projects and major maintenance/repairs.

A formal Capital Fund drive will be conducted during the 2019 year with a goal of raising a minimum of \$50,000.

In addition to the fund drive, a special offering will be collected each 5th Sunday to raise money for the Capital Fund along with various fundraisers throughout the year.

Projects to be completed will be prioritized based on consideration of health and safety, protection of property, project costs/availability of funds, emergency needs and other factors related to specific projects.

Projects currently being considered for funding by the Capital fund include:

Replace/repair entrance doors Repair/resurface parking lot and driveways Repair/replace carpeting in Sanctuary Installation of air conditioning in Sanctuary Installation of an emergency generator

Additional projects can be added for consideration as needs arise. The Session will review and pick order to which these projects will be addressed in 2019 at their January meeting.

The existing balance of funds from the Building Fund as of December 31, 2018 will be transferred into the newly established Capital Fund.

PROGRESS ON OUR GOALS

Rosie Swan and Mike Frame will be Session members on this team. Each church committee and group are asked to meet at least quarterly and have their recorder turn in minutes/notes to office following each meeting.

De Clutter-

Andrew Pihlblad and Mary Myers will be Session members on this team. The first area to be cleared is the balcony. The first day was to be Sunday, January 20. This will be rescheduled soon. If you have items stored there you will need to mark what they are and let Andrew or Mary know to make sure they get saved.

Capital Fund-

Dan Pihlblad, Tom Wade and Jim Roberts will be Session members on this team. Funds have started to come in and the first 5th Sunday will be on March 31. Envelopes will be in the pews for donations though out the year.
