Year C

Luke 1:1-4: 4:14-21



"Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."


<u>Excerpt from "Jesus returns Home"</u> By Gracia Grindal

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

3rd Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C Luke 1:1-4: 4:14-21

"I have to write that down". I often say that while talking with someone, to make sure that I keep facts straight. It certainly helps memory, but then people usually tell me, "But you also have to remember where you put your notes!" It is so true, as I have started several different notebooks in life with quotes about particular topics, but trying to retrieve it later, I struggled to recall under which topic I stored it. So, I read/review the whole notebook again. I know what the poet Robert Frost meant when he told Octavio Paz, "I never trust a man who doesn't re-read his favorite books!" This is what St Luke is telling us in the introduction to his gospel today, "I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus" (Luke 1:3) Inquiring minds want to know! I love Luke's aspiration to 1'investigate' 2'everything' 3'anew'. He is poring over the eyewitness sources of Jesus' life (stories and sayings that the apostles were repeating in their teaching) and organizing them into 'orderly and sequential' account. Luke had a mind for detail, and bible scholars like to say that his gospel is the most 'polished' in both its grammar and chronology. That he takes time to state at the beginning of his gospel account what purpose he was accomplishing by writing, demonstrates his intention to be accurate and true to history. He does this again in the introduction to his second volume 'The Acts of the Apostles' (Acts 1:1)

We are beginning the serial reading of Luke's gospel (Year C). Everyone has their favorite gospel. I love how each gospel writer is unique. After reading them enough, you can start to sense which particular gospel is being read, just from certain words they use (phrases) or their style of presenting events in Jesus' life. For example, Luke has the most number of parables, and the most unique parables of Jesus (Mark is fast-paced and action-based, Matthew has the most number of OT quotes, and John is on an island of his own-deepest!). So, as we listen this year to Luke's gospel together at Sunday Mass, I encourage you to discover what makes Luke unique!

Jesus comes home to Nazareth. As a faithful Hebrew, he attended synagogue services every sabbath (Lk 4:16-'as was his custom'). While there, He is asked to read and interpret an Old Testament verse/passage. After reading a self-prophetic passage from Isaiah (61:1–2), He surprisingly simply sits down. Instead of a lengthy sermon, he simply announces, "*Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing*" (4:21). In this bold, dramatic and performative act He is saying, "everything that Isaiah prophesied about the Messiah, you are looking at it!" Of course, this is overwhelming for His home synagogue to handle at this time, and confusedly they push back on such a message and style, and strongly reject Him. They send Him away.

Often people wonder why His own hometown rejected Him. Was it a theological disagreement? Were they alarmed at His boldness and confidence? Were they stuck in previous judgements they had of 'little Jesus' who grew up among us? Did they have their own self-serving plans to use His popularity to promote their village/synagogue? Something about the encounter certainly set them off, to the point of them even driving Him out of town, as if they might even 'push Him over a cliff' (Lk 4:29) Looking closer at the whole synagogue showdown, it was more than Jesus' disappointing 'sit-down' that enraged them. In His response to their gossipy murmuring, He pre-empts their manipulative schemes, exposing their thoughts. He tells of two Old Testament examples of outsiders being blessed ahead of the homefolks by Elijah and Elisha. They got the point that Jesus was not going to be manipulated. He wasn't returning to enrich the local economy, or run a campaign to be village mayor. His universalist compassion and anti-provincial message was not what they wanted to hear. So, violently, they ran Him off!

Jesus sums the whole experience up as 'no prophet is accepted in his/her own hometown'. I hear Jesus warning all of us not to overlook or be quick to reject what is 'too familiar'. Sometimes we sit atop treasure (*Like the Coventry Direct TV Commercial*) or unutilized gifts and don't realize it. Sometimes we search the world over, looking for something that we have held all the time (*like the greener grass on the other side of the fence*). I confess that I have been known to order a great new book (or new to me) and then discovered it on my bookshelf (*is it any excuse to claim that have books shelved in both the rectory and the office areas!*) So, Jesus calls us to be aware of what we already possess or what God has already placed right in front of us. God's grace is spread out before us, and it is we, who are missing it!
