A Message from Pastor Robert.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

I really love watching the world as it goes through a transition, which is why I love Wisconsin during the Fall and Spring. One could characterize Fall as a series of defeats, while Spring can be characterized as a series of victories. In the Fall as the air cools and the natural world slowly and beautifully retreats into a dormant state we too must start adding layers to our wardrobes as the air forces us to gradually retreat behind their warmth eventually covering every square inch of our exposed skin. At the same time we are also pulling in our bikes, lawnmowers, hoses, and various other tools and outdoor toys as we prepare to button down the hatches and retreat to the warmth of our fireplaces, blankets, space heaters, or whatever else we may have to keep us warm. The progression of Spring is just the opposite.
