SENS, a sensory-friendly show for individuals with special needs

For most of us, going to a theatre to catch a screening of our favorite movie is nothing out of the ordinary. However, for families of individuals with special needs, a trip to the movies can turn out to be an extremely challenging ordeal.

Individuals with sensory processing issues, particularly those on the Autism spectrum, can be hypersensitive to things encountered at the movies. Loud noises, long queues, sudden changes in light and large groups of people can be particularly overwhelming and in some cases, could even trigger a meltdown. "I have never taken my child to a theatre to see a movie" said many parents.

That's when an online forum for special needs children, aSPECIALworld, decided that something should be done about this .It was important that it had to be long-term, sustainable and so approached SPI Cinemas.

From the word go we found the SPI Cinemas team

SENS is the first-of-its-kind in India screening sensory-friendly versions of popular movies, offering a comfortable and adaptive movie-going experience for individuals with special needs and their families.

Features of this show include:

- Dimmed lights throughout the duration of the show
- Lowered sound levels
- Unrestricted movement and chatter within the cinema hall
- A longer intermission
- Sensitized attendants as ushers and in the washrooms



- Special parking facility for wheel chair users
- Attendants ready to wheel them and transfer to their seat and of course there is a lounge to help them calm down.

Additionally, keeping their dietary restrictions in mind, the menu offers specially designed sugar-free, gluten-free and casein-free foods.

"Introducing these special shows allows us to not only build an inclusive and welcoming atmosphere, but also to be more socially aware. Our aspiration is to make our cinemas accessible to everyone and even though we have a long way to go, SENS - which is part of a our project called #cinemaforeveryone, is a small step towards achieving that dream" Bhavesh Shah, Head of Experience, SPI Cinemas.

The SENS shows were launched simultaneously at Chennai and Coimbatore and over the year have proved to be a mega hit. SENS shows have been running to packed houses since August 2018. Apart from special families, some special schools have decided to make this their monthly outing-children, parents and teachers enjoy, clapping cheering and sharing popcorn!

These shows have now become a wonderful way of community building. Regular cine-goers also come for the shows, saying their child prefers 2D etc, they observe the SENS families and want to be associated with this movement!

The SENS shows are on first Sunday of every month, 10.30am in Sathyam Cinemas Chennai as well as The Cinema- Brookefields Mall, Coimbatore.

BLISS(Begin to Live Interdependently with Support Systems), is an initiative led by Poonam Natarajan, founder of Vidya Sagar and ex-chairperson of National Trust Govt. of India.

BLISS is focused on creating support systems in society so that adults with disabilities can live interdependently just like anyone. This ecosystem is an answer to the anxiety of many -"what happens when my family size diminishes", and will be made possible by the nine pillars of BLISS-

- Advisory center ,gives complete information on the services available for adults with disabilities.
- Employment center looks at creative solutions in skill training, open placements, entrepreneurship and also train job coaches.



 Manpower Development advocates, builds and nurtures cadre of skilled rehabilitation professionals ranging from personal attendants to job coaches.

- Swayam/ Group Homes are residential facilities to develop individual support systems in the community.
- TARA Team for Accessibility and Reasonable
 Accommodation works on access in personal spaces, like
 homes and workplaces. Get Going, accessible transport,
 is already making it easy for people with disability to
 reach work place, recreation places thus increasing
 socialization and inclusion.





- Maintenance Therapy to focus on evolving therapy and grooming program.
- Leisure This facility will advocate and expand choices in leisure for adults with disabilities. Peer Counselors to develop peer support for persons with disabilities.
- Disability Law Unit focuses on developing Trusts with support circles and relevant campaigns like housing and personal attendants.

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
