Superior National Forest lifts camping and heavy equipment restrictions on most Forest lands

Duluth, Minn., September 2, 2021 - Effective September 3, camping on Superior National Forest lands outside of developed campgrounds will again be open to visitors. This includes backcountry sites and dispersed camping.

At the same time, the Forest is lifting a heavy equipment restrictions, effective September 3, which allows certain land management activities to again operate during normal business hours.

Although these restrictions are being lifted, we ask that contractors and the public continue to practice diligence on forest lands as drought conditions remain, as does fire risk.

The following land management activities may now operate during normal working hours:

- Cutting forest products
• Use of Power Saws other than trimming loads
• Tractor, skidder, feller- buncher, forwarder logging operations
• Mowing and clearing grass and brush
• Road grading
• Dressing (sharpening) road grader blades on hardtop roads
• Preparing land for tree, shrub, or grass planting (e.g. roller choppers, anchor chains, and rock rakes)
• Any other mechanized operation that could create a spark and result in a fire
• Blasting activities outside of a defined mine

or pit

- Welding, using acetylene torches, or other devices with an open flame, to cut metal or rock
• Grinding metal and rock is also restricted.
• Parking vehicles and machinery in tall grass and vegetation
• Mechanized loading or hauling of any product or material for blasting

Forest officials made the decision to lift the closure as fall temperatures, recent rains, and shorter days have helped to moderate fire conditions and active fires.

The Forest is also closely coordinating land management restrictions and activities with the Minnesota DNR.

The Forest has several other closures in place for the Greenwood, John Ek and Whelp fires. A portion of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness has been reopened to visitors beginning on September 4. Backcountry/dispersed camping and heavy equipment activities continue to be restricted in these closure areas. Fire restrictions also remain in place on the Superior National Forest, and no open flames are allowed including campfires.
