From the Vicar

When November rolls around, my mind always skips ahead to Thanksgiving Day.

On that day, we gather to give thanks for all the many blessings which God has given to us: everything from family and friends to good weather and functional equipment to a nice big slice of pumpkin pie. And it is certainly right to give God thanks for such wonderful gifts.

Yet in the Bible, thanksgiving is spoken of as something that is done not only in times of blessing. Paul writes in Ephesians 5:20 that Christians should be "giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Keep in mind that Paul is writing this during his imprisonment in Rome. In the midst of this time of uncertainty and trials, though, Paul reminds the Christians in Ephesus to give thanks for everything, not only those things which appear to be blessings.

God sends times of trial to His people in addition to times of joy. He even sent His Son out into the wilderness to be tested by Satan. God doesn't do this out of anger or spite, but rather for the strengthening of our faith. James writes in his epistle, "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness." (James 1:2) Those troubles cause us to look to and trust in God, not ourselves, for everything we need. A loving father often gives his children things that they don't want, but does so for their own good. Likewise, we know that our Heavenly Father gives us exactly what is best for us, even when we don't understand how or why it could be so. We know this because He gave us the very best gift He had, His Son, for our salvation. And so we can give thanks, not only in good times and bad times, but even for good times and bad times, as we have a God who loves us more than we can even imagine.
