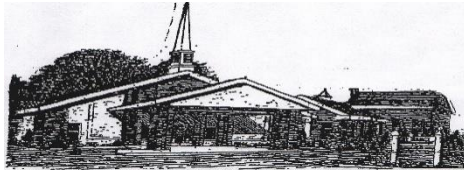

## FROM THE CALL COMMITTEE...

Dear fellow members,

On behalf of the call committee, I would like to provide you an update as to how the call process is going. Back in May we were notified that we had two potential candidates interested in our open position. If you recall, we are a multiple candidate call, versus a single candidate call - which requires two candidates to be interested in position in order to proceed with interviews, etc. Since that time we have met with each candidate either in person or through a Skype interview.

By next council meeting on September 11th:

- We will have witnessed each candidate preach.
  - We will have either a recommendation to council of a single candidate or we will advise the church council we have decided to move on from both candidates and start the process over.
  - You will also be brought up to date of the progress.
  - If, we recommend a candidate, he/she will be interviewed by the church council.
  - If, they are approved by council, we will then set up a weekend where the candidate could meet the congregation in a social setting (dinner and/or refreshments) on a Saturday to get to know the candidate.
  - He/she will preach the next Sunday (one service combined)
  - The congregation will immediately vote on candidate after the service (while the candidate is not present)
- Obviously, I may be getting ahead of myself with all these details. However, I felt it was important to remind you all of the steps that would happen in the call process.

As always, please feel free to reach out to me and/or any member of the call committee. In the meantime, please continue to keep the call committee and our congregation in your prayers as we contemplate these important decisions

### **Stewards of The Good News**



*“St. Paul’s Stewardship committee meets on the fourth Thursday of each month at 6:00 p.m. We are committed to sharing the Good news with our congregation and reminding them that stewardship is not just about money. It is about Love! We hope that our short messages shared on the fourth Sunday of each month challenge us all to reimagine the ways in which we steward God’s resources — time, talents and treasures — in response to God’s commandment to love God and our neighbors. Join us!”*

***The Stewardship Committee will begin to share a program called “Opening Your Spiritual Gifts” in September. The program will assist us all in opening our spiritual gifts by guiding us through three activities:***

***Scripture Review: highlighting scripture references that support the existence of spiritual gifts and identify those which are commonly found in service today. Watch for “Gift Definitions and References” in our Stewardship Insert in the bulletin beginning in a few weeks!***

***Self-Assessment: A list of 60 questions which will help you identify the gifts you have received in greatest measure. THIS ASSESSMENT WILL BE AVAILABLE ON OUR WEBSITE IN THE COMING WEEKS.***

***Exploration Of Use: Suggestions for the various types of ministry you might be most effective in because of your spiritual gifts.***

***The program will carry us through November 18<sup>th</sup> when we will celebrate our gifts together on Stewardship Sunday!***

The following is a temple talk given by Mrs. May Ertle on August 19<sup>th</sup>.

The Bible uses the word stewardship somewhat sparingly and though I searched diligently I could not find Jesus using the word stewardship at all. Instead, in Mark 9:33, when his disciples were bickering over who was the first, the most important, Jesus sat them down and let them know that the first shall be last of all and servant to all. Jesus let them know in no uncertain terms what their mission on earth would be. Jesus talked of being a good shepherd tending to his sheep. He never did went around saying “I am the greatest”, he just went about healing the blind, curing the lame and the ill, raising the dead, feeding 5000 with loaves and fishes, proclaiming the Kingdom of God without a lot of hoopla. Our church is full of people who are that kind of shepherd as well. First Peter 4:10 says “Each one, as a good manager of God’s different gifts, must use for the good of others, the special gift they have received from God.” Sitting quietly near the back of the church is Linda Rouzer who saw for years that fresh flowers were always on the altar every Sunday. In addition, Touch of Home packages sent to our college students and military personnel that were away from home. Freida Seiple tends to our Weis receipts, Dick Rehm tends our prolific garden. Joanne A. shared her talents for half her life seeing that the choir sang an anthem on Sunday AMS. The Friday ladies make lap robes to keep people in nursing homes warm. Nancy Fritz has seen for years that the pantry was stocked for people who need food. The altar guild sees that when we arrive at church on a Sunday the communion wine and bread are ready, altar clothes spotless, candles filled with oil, collection plates in place. Faye Jones with sister Kaye and Sam set up Celebration hall and prepare spaghetti dinners every month. Jeanette Richardson makes sure our ushers and greeters carry out their tasks. This year VBS was revived and led by Stephanie Stephens. Adrienne Martenco oversees our council. and Laura tends to everything else! And we have been blessed this year with another steward who came to help us in our transition and that is Adam Christian Reinhardt. Whoever named him must have had a premonition that he would choose to become a pastor.

Several years ago, I read a passage that said Christianity is only one generation away from extinction and it frightened me. And so, we talk about the third leg of Stewardship----our treasure. Pastor Harding never liked that term much said to just call it our money. Here at ST P we have a wonderful fellowship. Our passing of the peace is as though we have seen each other in months and it our mission to sustain that not only with our time and talent but with our treasure---our wealth. Are we willing to support with our wealth, our church and the Man who said, “I am the Good Shepherd” willing to die for you? And that is what he did----he died for our eternal salvation.

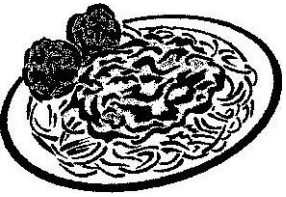

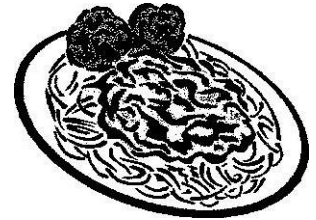

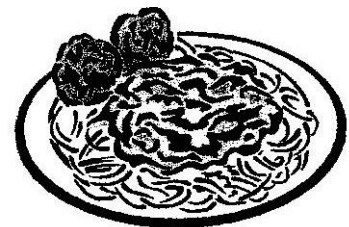
