

January Program: January 15th, 2023

Workshop and Lecture by Christine Barnes

Christine is a well-known quilter and published author from Northern California specializing in color for quilters.

Location: Zoom ONLY

Time: 11:00 to 4:00 pm (with ½ hour break for lunch) Cost: \$40.00 Includes Pattern Class Limit: 20 Member Only Limit

Workshop: You get to Choose

Join Christine Barnes' workshop where you get to choose which special effect you want your quilt to result in using the same pattern.

Luminaria – when you surround a relatively small area of warm, intense color with a larger area of cooler, less-intense, darker color, your quilt will appear to glow, as if light and warmth are coming from behind creating a *Luminosity* effect.

WORKSHOP SELECTION

Luminaria



Transparent Squares



OR

<u>**Transparent Squares**</u> – create an illusion of *Transparency*; layers of seethrough color with light center squares that seem to float above the darker shapes. Sections of gray ombre appear to flow underneath the blocks, enhancing the sense of light and movement.

This workshop begins with a crash course in color, followed by an evaluation of your fabrics to ensure success which will be surprisingly easy to achieve once you understand a few simple concepts. Then you'll begin cutting and piecing your blocks. Both quilts use the same pattern. Along the way, Christine will have lots of tips for making the process easier and more accurate.


Lecture: Christine Barnes Color: A Step-by-Step Tutorial

Learn how, *exactly*, Christine plans and makes a quilt? Which comes first, the design idea or the fabric? How to "hunt and gather" fabric for a quilt? How

does pattern affect color in fabrics? For the first portion of the lecture, Christine will show digital stepby-step images and describe her methods of choosing, auditioning, and editing fabrics. A trunk show of quilts and wearables wraps it all up.









Color Collaboration

Courthouse Quilters Guild 2023 Challenge

A spectrum of different colors is produced when light passes through a glass prism or through a drop of water. A prism bends light, taking in white light, refracting it, and revealing a mind-boggling array of colors.

Our hope is that CHQ's Color Collaboration Challenge will result in a vibrant spectrum of colored quilts almost as though we're standing inside a prism.

Challenge Rules

Make a monochromatic color schemed quilt panel exclusively using the single color and its tints, shades, and tones from the Joen Wolfrom color card you've received. White or black cannot be used. All submissions <u>must</u> measure 15" wide x 45" long. There are no restrictions in theme, subject matter or piecing techniques. The "Other" category is wide-open, although it must be done in a monochromatic color scheme. Please contact Anne Oswald at <u>aoswald827@gmail.com</u> to ask for a color card to be mailed to you or pick one up at the next meeting.

"In a monochromatic color scheme, the colors in the design all come from the same color family. Nature contains scores of examples of monochromatic color schemes. The subtle changes of desert sand can be beautifully monochromatic. A cold, bleak winter day can display hues from one family alone. The monochromatic scheme can be sophisticated and elegant. The most important ingredient...is value – the contrast of light and dark hues. This contrast can be subtle, softly contrasted, or strongly apparent... The monochromatic color scheme is the most difficult plan to work in". Joen Wolfrom, ColorPlay
