



EDITORIAL

I That Speak . . .

Christ spoke the word . . . heaven and earth were created! "By him were all things created." In the beginning was the Word — the creative Christ!

"Heaven and earth shall pass away," Christ tells us. He adds: "But my words shall not pass away."

"God, . . . hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son." His Son said: "Whatsoever I speak therefore, even as the Father said unto me, so I speak."

In Samaria, a woman spoke to Christ of the Messiah who was to come and "tell us all things." Christ answered: "I that speak unto thee am he."

Christ speaks with authority. He is the Truth! Beneath Him in authority are the apostles and prophets, whom God has set in the Church.

Paul was one such apostle of authority. He said: "In the sight of God speak we in Christ."

He also spoke of those who "pervert the gospel of Christ." Even so, today, there are some who set themselves in positions of authority, perverting God's way of setting men in the Church to please Him.

Thus, different voices, as "sounding

brass and tinkling symbols." declare: "This is the way, walk ye in it." The result: various organizations, movements and sects. Yet Christ remains the only true infallible Way!

* * *

But how shall we follow the exhortation of the Scripture to "obey them that have rule over you" if we don't know for certain who they are?

I believe the 5th chapter of John gives us a pattern for discerning God-sent, God-set leaders. In these verses Christ's example gives us four tests we may apply to any voice of authority today: . . .

THE TEST OF WORDS

A leader's words must be . . .

1. **God-centered:** seeking God's Will.

Christ said, "I can of mine own self do nothing . . . I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which sent me."

2. **Spirit-empowered,** . . . in demonstration of the Spirit and of power."

Christ said, "If I bear witness of myself, my witness is not true." Self-reference is insufficient. Christ did not speak with " . . . enticing words of man's wisdom." When He spoke, others had faith in God's power.

3. **Accompanied with works.**

Jesus said: "For the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me." God had sent Him, God was using Him! What need for further evidence? He spoke of the scribes and Pharisees in this manner: "For they say, and do not."

4. **God-honoured,** not self-seeking, men-honoured words.

Jesus said: "I receive not honour from men." He did not ask for recognition. He said: "I receive not testimony from man: but these things I say that ye might be saved."

He said to those self-seeking Jews: "How can ye believe, which receive not honour that cometh from God only?"

We needn't fear the leader who passes these four tests.

We invite your attention to a rec-

ent editorial in the U.S. News and World Report; David Lawrence, Editor. It deals with the "so-called 'religious issue' in American politics."

THE VOICE OF AUTHORITY

Mr. Lawrence said: "There can be no quarrel with the right of any preacher as an individual to speak out on any question—political, legislative, moral, social or economic. But may he presume to speak for the members of his congregation? Or, in the case of a national church organization, does he speak even for all the clergymen in such an organization?"

The two ways one person can speak for a group are: (1) if the group agrees on the issue spoken upon, and (2) if the group agrees as to the person to speak for them.

FIGHTING MEN OR ISSUES

E. C. Blake, a prominent officer of a church organization, mentions those who "attack not only the positions taken but the body taking the position."

We may be opposed to an issue, but may we fight the person or group who states their convictions?

We quote Billy Graham: "I am also concerned about some clergymen of both races that have made the 'race issue' their gospel . . . This doesn't mean that the race problem is not to be preached and taught—but it is not our 'gospel' nor are we to judge a man's relationship to God solely on the basis of his attitude on the race question."

Speaking with Tongues

*The sixth in a series on the Gifts of the Spirit
(Continued from May issue)*

IN THIS article we wish to continue the discussion of Speaking in foreign languages as the Spirit gives utterance in the form of questions and answers.

Question 1. When one speaks in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance does he speak real languages spoken by people in this world?

(A) There is no doubt that real languages spoken by different nationalities are often spoken under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. On the day of Pentecost people representing seventeen different nationalities heard the disciples speak in their own languages under inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Hear their testimony: "And they were all amazed and marvelled, saying one to another, Behold, are not all these which speak Galilaeans. And how hear we every man in our own tongue wherein we were born. . . . We do hear them speak in our tongues the wonderful works of God." Acts 2:7-11.

Many years ago a gospel party consisting of three young ladies was conducting a street meeting somewhere in Colorado. During the service one of the young ladies spoke in a foreign language under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. In that service there was a young man who was an Austrian by birth, who understood what she said because he heard her talk about Jesus in his own Austrian language. As a result of this sign (I Cor. 14:22) this young man attended the revival and was converted.

Several years ago a Methodist minister who did not believe in the baptism of the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in other tongues was in a prayer meeting that was being conducted by Spirit-Baptised believers. During the prayer service he heard a woman who knelt on one side of him say in the Greek language, "Get right with God.", and another woman kneeling on the other side said in the Hebrew tongue, "Get right with God.". Now this minister knew these women and he knew they did not know foreign lan-

guages. This incident caused this unbelieving believer to become convicted of his need. He sought the Lord and received the baptism of the Holy Ghost.

In a camp meeting conducted in Kingman, Kansas, my sister, Beulah, spoke, on one occasion, in one of the languages of India. A Mennonite bishop who had spent twenty years as a missionary in India was in that service and heard her speak. He was astonished at her perfect command of the language she spoke. He said that she spoke like an educated native of India, far better than he could speak the language after years of study and use of the language. This incident made a believer out of him.

(B) Sometimes the languages spoken under inspiration of the Holy Spirit are human languages unknown to anyone present, and some times it is the heavenly language unknown to anyone on earth. I Cor. 14:2; I Cor. 13:1.

Question 2. "Why did Paul ask the question, Do all speak with tongues?"

The subject under discussion in First Corinthians chapter twelve is the Gifts of the Spirit. I Cor. 12:1, 8-11, 30, 31. Paul's question in reality is, "Do all have the Gift of Tongues?" The answer, of course is, "No, all do not have the Gift of Tongues." The speaking in other tongues on those occasions was the sign or witness that they had received the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Without exception the only Scriptural evidence of the Spirit baptism is speaking in other tongues. Not all who speak in other tongues as a witness to their Spirit baptism receive the Gift of Tongues.

Question 3. Wasn't the Gift of the Holy Spirit received at Samaria (Acts 8:14-17) without the evidence of speaking in other tongues?

In the account of the great revival at Samaria it is not said that the disciples did or did not speak with tongues when they received the Gift of the Holy Spirit, but there is Strong

scripture evidence that they did. Jesus said that when the Spirit of truth is come, He shall testify, (John 15:26) and He shall speak. (John 16:13). Peter said that if one receives that which was prophesied by the prophet Joel it would be accompanied with speaking in other tongues. Acts 2:1-16 This being true, the disciples certainly spoke in other tongues at Samaria.

Why did Simon offer money that he might be given power to give the Holy Spirit on whomsoever he laid hands? Simon had seen mighty miracles take place, and he knew there was a great joy there. Acts 8:5-8. But he didn't offer money to be given power to heal the sick, cast out devils, and give people joy. He wanted power to give the Holy Spirit on whomsoever he laid hands. Why? No doubt Simon heard the disciples speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave utterance.

Question 4. "Are those who possess the Spiritual Gift of Tongues able to preach with understanding of what they are saying in a foreign language, and can they hold conversations with foreigners in their languages with mutual understanding of what is being said?"

All we know about speaking in other languages as the Spirit gives utterance is what we read in our Bibles. From a careful study of what the Scriptures have to say on the subject we have arrived at the following conclusions:

(1) Spirit baptised Christians may sometimes speak foreign languages and languages unknown to them under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, but which are understood by the foreigners who hear them speak. Acts 2:1-11.

(2) The companion Gift of Interpretation of Tongues is needed to cause the one who speaks in a foreign language to understand what he said. 1 Cor. 14:13, 14. It is said that the understanding of the one who speaks in an unknown tongue is "unfruitful", which is another way of saying that he doesn't understand what he is saying. A careful reading of the context of the last Scriptures referred to will make it clear that one who speaks in other tongues in a public meeting of the church needs to interpret his message for at least two reasons: (a) that the hearers may

be given an understanding of what has been said and thereby be edified, and (b) that the speaker may gain an understanding of what he said.

(3) There are no Scriptures that would lead one to believe that one who has the Gift of Tongues can ever understand what he says while speaking in other tongues under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit without the operation of the Gift of Interpretation.

Fifty Days

THERE were two great festival days that were kept by the Jews: The Passover; and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. There were several festival days that they kept, but these were the two more important ones. These two days, in a way, are also very important to the Christians in this Grace Dispensation. We do not observe the Passover, but we do observe the Lord's Supper; which is a continuation of the passover feast. We do not observe The Feast of Unleavened Bread, however we will have more to say on this thought at a later place in this article.

Jesus kept the last Passover with the Apostles in a borrowed room. Here He introduced the Lord's supper, which Christians observe: **"For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come."** I Corinthians 11:26. Actually this is a continued memorial of the deliverance of Israel from Egyptian bondage; however it has the added essence of the sacrifice of Jesus, The Lamb, once and for all, for the sins of humans. We remember the great deliverance from bondage but, the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus is the important memory of past days for us. Connected with this is the glorious hope, that burns so brightly in our hearts, of the return of, **"This same Jesus that went into the heavens."** Acts 1:11. According to Matthew 26:29, He will **"drink it new with us in my Father's kingdom."** So with the Jews who still remember the Passover, we remember the Passover but keep the Lord's Supper. This is the important mile stone or memorial marker for us as well as the important festival day of the Jews.

Let us consider a bit of the agriculture background of the land of Palestine as it is associated with this Passover and Lord's Supper time. The major harvest time was just after the Passover. For some fifty days they labored long and hard to gather the grain and fruit. On the fiftieth

day, the Feast of Unleavened Bread, started. Numbers 28:26, refers to this as, **"the day of the first fruits."** After the harvest, the reapers came with the first fruits to present to the Lord. These were given to the Priesthood, in forms of tithes (ten percent) and offerings (a percentage as the individual felt to give) to supply necessity of the Levites who looked after the spiritual welfare of the people and were given no inheritance of land. These fifty days were a special time of the year. The Passover was kept as a memorial and the people sought the Lord for strength to harvest the crop and also that the Lord would give them a bountiful harvest. On that fiftieth day, they came with the first fruits to show their appreciation for the blessings received and the rejoicing was on. Willingly they presented the best that they had harvested.

The contrast between these two days of the year was quite noticeable. There was some rejoicing in memory of deliverance but the oppression of bondage was heavy in memory as they kept the Passover. The hours of the harvest labor was ahead and the question of good or bad harvest was prevalent. So the feast of the Passover was a serious time. We keep the Lord's Supper with a solemn heart. We remember His death. Our joys are deep rooted and our emotions are held deep within us by the memory of the price Jesus paid for our redemption. We feel very keenly the allegiance that we owe Him. We eat his body and drink his blood for health and protection on the laboring harvest days that lie ahead. However not all is solemn and deep emotion. There is the hope of seeing Him and of being like Him that brings joy to our hearts.

When the Christian Church began, during the period of the death, burial, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, a glorious fulfillment of the prophecies of the prophets and the promise of Jesus, took place. The

dark hours of betrayed, agony, death, and hopelessness were past and Jesus appeared to many, in various ways and fashions, during the days following His resurrection. Then in the words of Luke 24:49-53, He told them that He would send the promise of the Father. **Go ye to Jerusalem and there tarry until ye be endued with power from on high.** Here is denoted something greater than being in the presence of Jesus. It is difficult for us to grasp that anything would be more glorious than to have walked and talked with Jesus along the shore of Galilee. Jesus said, **"power from on high is coming."** Their hearts began to grasp the hope here presented. Instead of being sorrowful at his leaving their hearts abounded with expectancy. He lifted His hands and blessed them and as He did He was parted from them and carried into the heavens. No doubt there was some concern or fascination about all this, because, in Acts 1:10-11, the angel awakened them from their steadfast gazing up into the heavens with these words, **"Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven."** Jesus had led them out as far as Bethany and with the awakening words of the angel they remembered the commandment of Jesus. They worshipped Jesus and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. The blessing of the Master had begun to bubble up in their hearts. The glory of the Lord was springing up like a fountain. It did not quickly play out but they continued, in the temple, praising and blessing God. Glory hallelujahs rolled from their souls. Happiness saturated the atmosphere. Hearts swelled with the essence of eternal joy. This began to work toward wonderful feeling amongst them. Hearts were melted and the feeling of accord became prevalent. Let us read Acts 2:1, **"And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they**

were all with one accord in one place." The days of the crucifixion had mellowed these hearts. Through the succeeding few days, of keeping the commandment of Jesus, these hearts had progressed to a place beyond that of human ability. 120 souls melted together in the bond of unity. They had allowed the great sanctifying power of Christ to do something that human ability could not do. It is hard for us to comprehend 120 different personalities brought into one accord. It happened fifty days after the Passover. A notable happening indeed when 120 lose their own desire to do the will of God.

I would be happy, and God would be well pleased, if we had more occasions where 120, more or less, could pray through to such victory that the sanctifying blood of Jesus would cover each life until desires would be blended together in one accord. It might take fifty days of praying and some severe persecutions to get some of us to this place of accord but the glory would roll and the blessings would come. Let me add a little sidelight here: when we do what the Lord says to do glorious things happen.

When the day of Pentecost was fully come (50 days from the keeping of the Passover and the beginning of the Lord's Supper)- the promise of Jesus was fulfilled. "I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you." John 14:18. We, of the grace dispensation, remember this as a wonderful day. Here was fulfilled the words of John the Baptist Luke 3:16, "John answered, saying unto them all, I indeed baptize you with water; but one mightier than I cometh, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire:"

Acts 2:2-4 "And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them clo-

ven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2:15-18, Simon Peter stood and spoke these words: "For these are not drunken, as ye suppose, seeing it is but the third hour of the day. But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel: And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophecy, and your young men shall see visions and your old men shall dream dreams: and on my servants and on my handmaidens I will pour out in those days of my spirit; and they shall prophesy:" As he closed his preaching that day he left these words: Acts 2:39, "For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call."

From this glorious outpouring at Jerusalem they went forth to spread the gospel far and wide. Fifty days from the Passover, the outpouring of the Holy Ghost, in baptismal form, lit the spark that has carried the shining light of the glorious gospel to the four winds of the earth. We are nearing the fulfillment of the words of Jesus, Matthew 24:14, "And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." This first outpouring was as the former rain. The latter rain came on that notable day, as the year 1900 rolled away and 1901 was ushered in. where some souls had been fasting, praying, and studying the word of God, in Topeka, Kansas under the direction of the late Rev. Charles F. Parham. A like contrast to the fiftieth day after the Passover where one accord was met and the glorious blessing of the Holy Ghost in baptismal form was poured out. Let us read Hosea 6:3, "Then shall we know if we follow on to know the Lord:

his going forth is prepared as the morning; and he shall come unto us as the rain, as the latter and former Rain unto the earth." We have lived nearly sixty years in this seed filling rain. The Devil has tried to counterfeit this glorious gift with fanaticism, or fleshly manifestations, but in spite of all the unseemly things there still remains the beautiful blessing of waiting on the Lord and receiving the gift of the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in other language as the Spirit gives utterance.

We do not keep the Passover or Lord's Supper on a set date once a year. Therefore the fiftieth day afterwards has no set yearly time. We follow the words of Paul in keeping the Lord's Supper: "as oft as ye do this in remembrance of me ye do shew the Lord's death till he comes." The Holy Ghost has been the Comforter since that wonderful fiftieth day after the first Lord's Supper, so we recognize him in all our worship day by day and hour by hour.

However in view of the commemoration of Easter the fiftieth day would fall in early June. I am not so much concerned about the fiftieth as I am the memory of the glorious outpourings of the former and latter rains and the arriving of the Comforter, and the fact that He is with us today, and will be our guide and power until he be taken out of the way to prepare the way for the rise of the anti-Christ and the wind-up of the Gentile dispensation, the seventy weeks of Daniel's prophecy concerning Israel, and the ushering in of a thousand years reign with Jesus as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Let us remember the words of Paul to the Ephesians 4:30, "And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."

His words to you: "If any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed."

Love in Action

The greatest sermon on LOVE was not preached by word of mouth, neither was it written by the pen of any inspired writer. It was preached in silence by the suffering Saviour as He submitted to the cross and died for sins he did not commit. Others have died by force, Jesus died willingly. Some have died for good men, Jesus died for wicked ones. Many have died for their friends, Jesus died for His enemies. He died because He wanted to save them from eternal death.

Even while He was suffering from their cruelty He prayed for them. He refused to show any bitterness toward the enemies who were crucifying Him, for it was for them He was dying. He might have reviled and threatened them for their injustice but instead, He said, "**Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.**"

HERE IS LOVE IN ACTION! Here was positive proof that when Jesus said He loved men He meant it! Here was a demonstration of the worth Christ placed upon human souls. Here was a definition of LOVE that all could understand.

Do our actions speak on that kind of love, or are we self-centered and indifferent to the needs of others? Do we sacrifice to show our love for others, or do we only say we love them? John said, "**Hereby perceive we the love of God, because He laid down His life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.**" "**But whoso hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him? My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth.**" **I John 3:16-18.** Many sermons are preached by word of tongue; but few by daily deeds.

Men and women perish in their sins because no one has ever touched their hearts with a demonstration of real love. We say we love the souls of men but our actions deny it. We say

we love God but if we do not love our fellow-men we have seen, how can we love God whom we have not seen?

The Apostles were mightily moved by the crucifixion of Christ. They understood that when Christ died, He set an example for us, that we should follow in His steps. Peter said we have been called to show that we too can suffer injustice without resentment: to be healed of all selfishness, rebelliousness, and natural meanness. Paul wrote of the love that suffers long and still is kind: never is jealous; that never exalts self; that never swells its chest but beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. This is the love that loves the unlovely; that keeps on showing kindness in spite of rebuffs, that keeps praying for sinners no matter how discouraging the prospect of their conversion might be; and has faith; in new converts no matter how vascillating they may seem to be.

This love is not man-made but divine. It is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost. It is demonstrated in our lives as we keep ourselves in the LOVE of God and keep praying in the Spirit. **PRAISE THE LORD!**

not to be our "gospel," neither can we judge a man's spirituality solely on the basis of his convictions on certain matters of Church government.

But Mr. Graham did say: "This doesn't mean that the race problem is not to be preached or taught." We may state our convictions on certain issues in disagreement with others. But, I emphasize, we are not to make it our "gospel!"

We quote Mr. Blake again. He said that the historical record will reveal "that churches and preachers have usually been at their best when they dared to speak out against all human premises as they believed God wanted them to speak."

But he also said: "Let it be clearly understood that to try to preach or speak in the name of God is in fact a dangerous business Humility before God is a requisite."

GOVERNMENT AND DOCTRINE

There is a difference between government and doctrine. Government is the means of promoting the doctrine of the Lord Jesus Christ—the Gospel. God set "helps and "governments" in the Church along with gifts of the Spirit and gifts of men. There isn't always a clear pattern of Church government to follow. However, this rule must govern each of us: "Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another."

MACHINERY AND HARVEST

We are aware of the trend of some in the Church world to over-emphasize program and method in spreading the Gospel, and to under-emphasize the purpose for which it is to be used.

A farmer could buy a dozen new combines and never pull one of them into the field. New combines do not guarantee a harvested crop! But, needless to say, he still needs a combine if he has a crop to be harvested.

The Church must have its government and its leaders if it is to reap a "harvest." It is true, however, that the "machinery" can be over-emphasized.

One thing is clear: all government in the Church under the authority of men must recognize Christ as supreme. "The government shall be upon his shoulder."

"Never man spake like this man!"

A Lesson on Patience

In this article we wish to deal with the word, **Patience**. Webster says patience is the quality of being patient or calmly enduring.

When we face the trials that Jesus speaks about in these last days in Luke 21:17, "And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake." Verse 18: "But there shall not an hair of your head perish." Verse 19: "In your patience possess ye your souls."

Romans 5: verse 1, "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

(Verse 2) "By whom also we have access by Faith into this grace where in we stand.

(Verse 3) "And not only so, But we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulations worketh PATIENCE;

(Verse 4) "And **patience**, experience; and experience hope.

(Verse 5) "And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us. Romans 12:12, "Rejoicing in hope; **Patient** in tribulations; continuing instant in prayer."

Romans 15:4, "For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through **Patience** and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope.

(Verse 5) "Now the God of **Patience** and consolation grant you to be like-minded one toward another according to Christ Jesus:"

2 Cor. 6:3, "Giving no offence in anything, that the ministry be not blamed:

(Verse 4) "But in all things approving ourselves as the ministers of God, in much **Patience**, in afflictions, in necessities, in distresses," Col. 1:10 "That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God;

(Verse 11) "Strengthened with all

might according to His glorious power, unto all **Patience** and longsuffering with joyfulness."

I Thess. 1:3, "Remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labor of love, and **Patience** of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God and our Father;"

I Thess. 5:14, "Now we exhort you brethren, warn them that are unruly, comfort the feeble minded, support the weak, be **patient** toward all men." Heb. 10:36 "For ye have need of **Patience**, that after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise."

(Verse 37) "For yet a little while, and He that shall come will come, and will not tarry."

Heb. 12:1, "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed, about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with **Patience** the race that is set before us."

James 1:3, "Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh **Patience**

(Verse 4) "But let **Patience** have her perfect work; that ye may be **perfect** and entire, wanting nothing."

James 5:7, "Be patient therefore brethren, unto the coming of the Lord. Behold, the husbandman waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth,

and hath long **patience** for it, until he receive the early and latter rain.

(Verse 8) "Be ye also **Patient**; stablish your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

(Verse 9) "Grudge not one against another, brethren, lest ye be condemned: Behold, the judge standeth before the door.

(Verse 10) "Take my brethren, the prophets who have spoken in the name of the Lord, for an example of suffering affliction, and of **patience**.

(Verse 11) "Behold, we count them happy which endure, ye have heard of the **patience of Job**, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the Lord is very pitiful, and of tender mercy."

Rev. 3:10, "Because thou hast kept the word of my **Patience**, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation, which shall come upon the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth.

(Verse 11) "Behold, I come quickly hold that fast which thou hast, that no man take thy crown."

We must have Faith, hope and Christian love, and Patience to endure all the trials that come our way.
