

The Bible Project Proposal for the Congregational Level

General Description and Purpose

The Bible Project is designed to lead congregation members to grasp a foundational understanding of the Bible at an adult level. It puts the content of Scripture in a thematic structure so that participants can perceive the plan revealed by God for his world and people.

The plan envisions starting with the congregational level in September 2018. 20 Old Testament lessons and 20 New Testament lessons will be taught over a two-year period for 1-hour class periods. Students will be asked to read and remember certain portions of Scripture, attend 60 minute classes and review the handout materials between classes.

Teachers will have been preparing for two years to teach and lead classes by the time September, 2018, comes. They were recruited for this purpose and understand that leading classes has been the goal of their extensive and intensive training period.

Classes could be a part of the current Wednesday night plan. Or that plan could be restructured into 3 7-week sessions

The concept is to engage 200 or more participants. A notebook and handouts are provided. A Registration Fee would be required for each year—about \$20 per person to cover costs and to provide a basis for commitment to the classes.

Proposed schedule for publicity and registration

Registration would open beginning on April 8, 2018 (Sunday AFTER Easter) and continue for the remaining Sundays and Wednesdays of April. A Table for Registration in both the Narthex and Mission Hall would be ideal. A formal "Registration Card" will be available.

Leading up to Registration would be a promotional "campaign" designed to inform the whole congregation about the importance and methodology of the Bible Project platform. The promotional period would start January 14 and continue through April 1. This would involve at least the following:

- Testimonies in the services
- Connect announcements
- Connect inserts or half page inserts in the Worship Order (as with today's Poinsettia insert
- Wednesday evening announcements
- "Creative" and attention-seeking displays in the Narthex, Mission Hall and the CLC
- Visits by Bible Project Teachers to various groups within the church
- Web page and Facebook presentation

Session and leaders need to agree that this will be a major focus for the coming two years if there is hope that this will reach a significant portion of the congregation. Is that best obtained by formal Session approval? It will mean certain sacrifices in terms of Congregational activities and participation. And it will require some budget.
