# **Feast of the Holy Family**

Happy feast day to Holy Family of Nazareth! And Happy family day to our own families! Let us take this opportunity to offer our families and their members on the altar to ask God's blessing on them and to obtain for them the guidance of the Holy Family of Nazareth. Moreover, we take this celebration as an opportunity to reflect on the importance of family as it is palled and designed by God Himself. To help our personal reflection, let me begin with a report on a study on cancer and heart disease. A few years ago, a study was undertaken to find the U.S. city with the lowest incidence of cancer and heart disease. The winner was Rosetto, Pennsylvania. Soon experts descended upon the city expecting to see a town populated by non-smokers, people who ate the correct food, took regular exercise, and kept close track of their cholesterol. To their great surprise, however, the researchers discovered that none of the above was true. They found instead that the city's good health was tied to the close family bonds that prevailed within the community. This suggests that there is much to be said for a close and loving family relationship.

I find this study is both interesting and challenging. It is interesting for I have never thought that close and loving family relationship could reduce the chance to get cancer and heart disease. At the same time, it is challenging as it raises some reflective questions in my mind: am I a good family member? Do I maintain a good relationship with my family members? Thank God if I am and I do. If I am not, however, maybe it is time to correct my relationship with my family members. Our main concern is how do maintain and strengthen a close and loving family relationship.

Let us turn to the Family of Nazareth for it offers many practical lessons for family life. Firstly, don't let your problems undermine your family. Although it is called holy and perfect family, it was never free from problems. Like other families, the Holy Family went through many hardships. Jesus was constantly under threat since He was a baby. His life ended in the hands of his enemies who hang Him on the cross. Jesus, however, was not alone. His Mother, Mary, was with Him going through it all. And so did Joseph. One thing we admire of this family is that the problems didn't break their family bond. The problems helped improve and strengthen their family relationship. Like the Holy Family, let not our problems undermine our family but embrace them as opportunities to shape, improve and strengthen our families. Secondly, let God take control of our families. The survival of the Holy Family was the fruit of their intimate relationship with God. God Himself was at the centre of the Holy Family. They have a strong belief that God was in control of their small family as it went through many trials and tribulations. He guided and protected them. Like the Holy Family, let us allow God to take charge of our families. Thirdly, the importance of encouragement. Both Mary and Joseph worked hard, helped each other, understood and accepted each other, and took good care of their Child so that He might grow up not only in human knowledge but also as a Child of God. We see here the value of encouragement. Our families too need to nourish the importance of encouragement. Fourthly, the importance of forgiving love. The Nazareth Family successfully transformed its family into a confessional rather than a courtroom. Husband and wife and the rest of the family need not act like attorneys at courtroom to justify their behaviour but showing readiness to admit and try to correct them. The family will live in a peaceful harmony. Last but not least, be responsible



parents. Mary and Joseph took a grave responsibility of their son, Jesus, so do parents whose marriages are blessed with children. They are a gift from God to you and you are accountable before God.

Let us pray for the grace of caring for one another in our own families, for each member of our parish family, and for all families of the universal Church. May God bless all our families in the New Year!

#### #55 UPDATE: GENERAL LITURGICAL GUIDELINES COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melb Information Updated: 23 December 2021, 5:00pm

As of 11.59pm Wednesday 23 December 2021, the following measures will be applied to Masses at Sacred Heart Parish::

From 11:59pm Thursday 23 December 2021, face coverings will be required for gatherings indoors (except in the home) for people aged eight and over, or for those with medical exemptions.

All Catholics in Melbourne continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further directed by the Archbishop. We continue to carry the happy obligation to keep Sunday holy, whether we can attend Mass or not, and can do so by any kind of prayer with members of our household and parish, reading holy scripture, and encouraging one another in our faith. 
