Thanksgiving Turkey Talk by: Denise Simion

Turkeys will soon be the center of attention on tables throughout the country. While most of us eat a domestic bird, wild turkeys are found in many areas across the U.S., including most counties in Michigan.

Wild turkeys disappeared from Michigan by 1900, probably due to loss of habitat and unregulated hunting. Michigan brought wild turkeys from Missouri and Iowa in the 1980s, and there are now more than 200,000 wild turkeys in Michigan. Perhaps you've seen some along the road or in a field. Wild turkeys can typically be seen nearby at Kensington Metropark.

Benjamin Franklin wanted wild turkeys to be our national symbol instead of the bald eagle. He felt that the stately, majestic qualities of the wild turkey would make it a fine symbol for the new country. One of the largest birds in North America, an adult gobbler (male) can grow up to 4 feet long from his beak to his tail. In spite of its large size and rather awkward appearance, the wild turkey is a powerful flier, reaching speeds of up to 55 mph over distances up to a mile. The white, domestic turkey lost its ability to fly through selective breeding that created heavier, broad-breasted birds, a feature much desired by chefs and commercial turkey producers. The shorter legs of the domestic turkey also mean it can't run as well as wild turkeys. Unless someone hunts and brings home a wild turkey for dinner, domestic turkeys are served on Thanksgiving.

By the way, a group of turkeys is called a rafter, and baby turkeys are called poults. Adult males are gobblers and females are hens. Have a wonderful holiday, and Happy Thanksgiving!

DID YOU KNOW?

Useful Information

HOW TO HELP KEEP YOUR DRAINS CLEAR & AVOID PLUMBING COSTS

Do **NOT** flush wipes down the toilet. Wipes do not biodegrade, **EVER!** The label may read "flushable" but NONE are. Wipes are made of spun fiber & more commonly today, plastic textiles made of polyester or polypropylene.

If you're flushing wipes & have not experienced a plumbing problem, someone else in your building may have. **Wipes will clog a drain eventually!** Wipes need to be disposed of in the trash. That is the only method to avoid serious plumbing issues in your unit & in your neighbor's unit. Thank you all for your adherence to this practice.

WINTERIZING OUTSIDE WATER SPIGOTS

Any spigot exposed to winter weather will need to be winterized to avoid freezing line & property damage. This is each individual unit's responsibility. Hoses must be removed & left off of the spigot to winterize. Anti-sipon/frost free hose bibbs can be winterized easily by turning off the supply valve inside the unit & draining the outside spigot. To drain: Older spigots that have hose bibb vacuum breakers (HBVB) installed on them require an extra step depending on the type installed. Hose bibb vacuum breakers with a pin sticking out where the hose would thread on, simply pull down on the pin until the water stops dripping. Hose bibb vacuum breakers with a black ring around the body can be winterized by pulling up on the black ring to allow the water to drain out. It is very important to drain the water from whatever type of HBVB you have every year to avoid freezing pipes & damage to your unit.

CENSUS 2020 IS RIGHT AROUND THE CORNER

If you're a Snowbird & spend six months or more in Michigan, make sure you are counted as a resident of Michigan in the 2020 census. It's important to be counted in your state of residence because Michigan loses over \$18,000 during the 10-year census period for each resident not counted. That census determines how billions of federal dollars are allocated for schools, businesses, roads, & services for older adults in Michigan!



HOW TO ENROLL IN MICHIGAN

- In 2020, for the first time, the U.S. Census Bureau will accept responses online or via phone. You can still respond by mail if you prefer.
- An invitation to respond online with a unique Census ID code will be mailed to every address in the U.S. in mid-March & include instructions on responding online or by phone.
- If you spend more than six months each year in Michigan, use the unique Census code sent to that address or wait until you get home. If you do the Census by phone, use your Michigan address when responding. **REMEMBER: Watch out for scams.** The Census workers will **NEVER** call you or ask for your Social Security number. Your Census responses are safe, secure & by law your responses cannot be used against you in any way!



Plowing will begin early morning of Heritage Dr. & all other streets. By 8:00 am the plows will be plowing parking areas. As your street gets plowed the drivers will sound a loud horn to let you know to move your cars to plowed areas so they can plow the parking areas.

Everyone must do their part to make this successful & keep the costs down. If vehicles are not moved it requires hand shoveling which will be at the vehicle owners expense & a fine for violation of rules.

IF you cannot move your car please ask a neighbor or make arrangements to park your car off site.

Also, remember, if you are leaving your unit for a period of time you must park your car off site or make sure you have someone who can move it for you.

Snowbirds & others who leave for the winter make sure you set your thermostat no lower than 60 degrees. **DO NOT** shut off your heat when you leave, the heat **MUST** be left on. You need to leave a key with a neighbor or someone else in the South Lyon area. Notify **Property Management Office of who should be contacted for emergency access to your unit.** If your pipes burst & Management can't get into your unit not only your place is flooded but your neighbors also.






