





The California "Motor Voter" Law Will Allow Illegal Aliens To Vote

A California state bill was just signed in to law by Gov. Jerry Brown, that will register and allow illegal aliens to vote in US Elections.

The New Motor Voter Act (A.B.1461) that is now law in California, automatically registers residents of California to vote at the DMV. According to the law and a report by the Washington Times, "The New Motor Voter Act automatically registers to vote all eligible voters when they obtain or renew their drivers licenses at the Department of Motor Vehicles instead of requiring them to fill out a form."

"The goal is to ease barriers to voting, but election-integrity advocates warn that the measure could inadvertently add millions of illegal voters to the rolls given that California allows undocumented aliens to obtain drivers licenses."

California state officials are praising the law and Alex Padilla, California's Secretary of State says, "Citizens should not be required to opt in to their fundamental right to vote. We do not have to opt in to other rights, such as free speech or due process. The right to vote should be no different."

State Assemblywoman Lorena Gonzalez from San Diego said, "This bill will lead to millions more registered California voters, which means more people we can talk to."

The RAW Scoop is this. Critics of the law have called it for what it really is. Absolute and complete voter fraud and corruption on a grand scale. Stephen Frank from California Political Review issued a statement saying, "A.B. 1461 assures corruption of our elections. Our elections will look like those of Mexico and other corrupt nations and honest people will stop voting, since illegals will out vote them." Linda Paine of the Elections Integrity Project says, "Citizens must oppose this treasonous attempt to turn California into a form of government that gives control to non-citizens."

Tribute to Veterans

Sitting on the steps outside his house a few months ago, Doug Dworshak considered what he would do with the Dutch elm he decided to cut down when the idea came to him.

Standing in front of 312 12th St. N.W., Mandan is a tribute to U.S. veterans made from the stump of Dworshak's tree.

"I cut down my tree, but I didn't want to cut it down completely," he said. "So, what do I do with it?"

Dworshak said the memorial is for the men who have defended American freedom and the ones who died for it.

It took him a couple months to strip and varnish the tree stump before he could assemble the tribute in September.

An eagle perches on top of the trunk, which is decorated with a POW MIA plaque and yellow ribbon that means welcome home. A flag pole displays the American and POW MIA flags behind the tree trunk.

"I thought it would look pretty decent," said Dworshak, a peacetime veteran of the North Dakota Army National Guard.

A number of people have stopped to look at the tribute, including members of ABATE of North Dakota

"They love it," he said. "They say they've seen nothing like it, and it all started from my tree."

The display will be permanent, Dworshak said.

Teens Create Pallbearer Program to Carry Homeless Vets in Final Hour

Dozens of high school students have volunteered to help give the homeless or lonely one last moment of dignity.

Their mission: carry the **veterans** who have no families to their final resting place.



Six teenagers from the University of Detroit Jesuit High School in Michigan served as pallbearers this week at three funerals for deceased vets with no one to claim them.

Students at the school created the pallbearer program and, so far, more

than 50 students have signed up for the program.

"The men we honored today put their lives on the line for our country and now they deserve our dignity and service in return," senior Leonard Froehlich, one of the pallbearers, said. "We honor these service members by being with them...and that in itself is a privilege."



November 2, 1962 - During the Cuban Missile Crisis, President John F. Kennedy announced on TV, "the Soviet bases in Cuba are being dismantled, their missiles and related equipment being crated, and the fixed installations at these sites are being destroyed."

November 6, 1860 - <u>Abraham Lincoln</u> was elected as the 16th U.S. President and the first Republican. He received 180 of 303 possible electoral votes and 40 percent of the popular vote.

November 7, 1962 - Richard Nixon told news reporters in Los Angeles "...just think how much you're going to be missing. You won't have Nixon to kick around any more, because, gentlemen, this is my last press conference."

November 9, 1872 - The <u>Great Boston Fire</u> started in a dry-goods warehouse then spread rapidly in windy weather, destroying nearly 800 buildings. Damage was estimated at more than \$75 million.

November 9, 1989 - The Berlin Wall was opened up after standing for 28 years as a symbol of the Cold War. The 27.9 mile wall had been constructed in 1961

November 17, 1800 - The U.S. Congress met for the first time in the new capital at Washington, D.C. President John Adams then became the first occupant of the Executive Mansion, later renamed the White House.

November 19, 1863 - President <u>Abraham Lincoln</u> delivered the <u>Gettysburg Address</u> during ceremonies dedicating 17 acres of the Gettysburg Battlefield as a National Cemetery.

November 19-20, 1990 - The Cold War came to an end during a summit in Paris as leaders of NATO and the Warsaw Pact signed a Treaty on Conventional Forces in Europe, vastly reducing their military arsenals.

November 22, 1963 - At 12:30 p.m., on Elm Street in downtown Dallas, President John F. Kennedy's motorcade slowly approached a triple underpass. Shots rang out. The President was struck in the back, then in the head. He was rushed to Parkland Memorial Hospital where fifteen doctors tried to save him. At 1 p.m., John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 35th President of the United States, was pronounced dead. On board Air Force One, at 2:38 p.m., Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President.

November 26, 1789 - The first American holiday occurred, proclaimed by President George Washington to be Thanksgiving Day, a day of prayer and public thanksgiving in gratitude for the successful establishment of the new American republic.

November 29, 1947 - Palestine was partitioned into Jewish and Arab land by the U.N. General Assembly, resulting in the establishment of the Jewish state of Israel the following year.
