
Third Thursday Summer Tour


Rog Anderson & Lynne Groven hosted the second (Third Thursday) summer tour.

Get together with your Model "A" Friends October 3-7, 2018

Registration is now open for the 2018 Model "A" Get-together, October 3-7 at the Whitewater State Park Group Camp in southeastern Minnesota.

The camp will be open for early birds on Wednesday, Oct. 3, at 1 P.M. and will close after Sunday breakfast and clean-up October 7.

Over 80 Model "A"ers attended in 2016, from Iowa, Minnesota and Wisconsin.

Location:

Take HWY. 74 north from St. Charles then turn west on the gravel group camp road at the bottom of the large hill near the south end of the park. Park Headquarters and the RV campground are further north on HWY. 74.

Meals:

Breakfast and dinner will be provided in the camp dining hall and mid-day lunches will be at your expense during touring activities. Use of the commercial kitchen for packing lunches is an option, and you are welcome to use the large walk-in cooler for storing food and your favorite beverages or snacks.

Fees:

Adult pre-registration cost is \$45 per day or \$50 per day per person after September 15 An early bird fee for Wednesday allows full use of the camp.

*There are no partial daily fees for selected attendance of events.

Entertainment:

Evenings will be geared for relaxed conversation and fun,(bring cards and puzzles), with formal entertainment on Saturday night.

Where to Stay:

Sleeping cabins are available at the group camp at no extra charge. Just bring a sleeping bag or bedding. A separate shower and

modern bathroom building is nearby.

<u>ml</u> The Whitewater Valley Motel in St. Charles, 507-932-3142, is five miles south of camp.

Rates start at \$60 for double occupancy. Motels are also available in Winona or Rochester.

Check-in Wednesday afternoon and enjoy the park on your own. An evening dinner drive is planned. Organized tours will leave Thursday through Saturday.

Park Vehicle Stickers:






THE A'OOGAH NEWSLETTER DECEMBER 1995

"All you ever wanted to know about my Model A Roadster and more."

y introduction to the Model A Ford was in the early '60's, during the years that I was courting my wife Bonnie. Bonnie was raised by her grandparents, Art and Hilma, and she grew up just outside of Danbury, Wisconsin. Grandpa was a painter by trade, but he subsidized his income by farming the small parcel of land on which the family homestead was located. In grandpa's opinion there was only one automobile ever built and that auto was the Model A Ford.Although Art owned many Model T Fords during his younger days, many of which he made into speedsters, his favorite vehicle by

far was the Model A Ford. The only Model A owned by the time we met was a tractor. It consisted of a shortened frame with double AA rear end, a standard three speed transmission with a three speed Warford transmission

coupled to it. The combination gave the tractor 9 speeds forward and three in reverse. It was great for plowing, hauling firewood, hunting and just plain running around in the acres of woods surrounding the property.

But enough reminiscing, my next encounter with the Model A Ford was in 1985, when I stopped for gasoline at a Food 'N Fuel near my home in Anoka. At the pump across from me was the cutest little Niagara blue 1928 Model A Coupe. The owner, whom I had seen passing my home several times with his car. was filling it's gas tank. In passing I remarked

how much I liked his car, to which the owner, if you haven't guessed yet, was Ray Bragg who immediately responded with "would you like to go for a ride?" Well, I paid my bill, parked my car, hopped in and away we went for a cruise around the neighborhood.

Next it was in the spring of 1986 that I happened to wander through a car show at the Anoka Continued on Dage 4 County Fairgrounds and spotted my "A" on a saturday, but had to suffer through until monday before I was able to purchase it. It was purchased through the Toy Store in East Bethel, Mn. and from that day the car has been on the road constantly, except for short periods of time.

Within weeks of purchasing the vehicle, I attended my first TCMAFC Clinic and joined the Club in 1986. installations. The last time the engine was replaced was in 1993. I also put in a rebuilt transmission. The final touch included a set of new tires, due to the fact that I had worn out one set since I had purchased the car. I also installed a set of high speed gears in the rear end and an alternator. Hopefully the car is now ready for many years of trouble free motoring.

Over the years I have traveled

My "A" was built on 7/28/28. Since it's purchase, I have driven it approximately 20,000 miles.

The car I purchased was an older restoration, and because my intention was to drive the vehicle, most of my efforts have gone into keeping the car mechanically fit. Early on, the engine that came in my Model A was pulled for rebuilding, and not wanting to miss any driving time I installed a used engine. It lasted for about one and a half years before the rebuilt engine had to be installed. The rebuilt engine lasted one year, at which time, due to had babbit, that engine had to be removed, rehabbited and then replaced for the second time. By this time I was becoming quite good at

through the states of Illinois, lowa, Minnesota, Missouri, and Wisconsin. In the future I hope to drive to North Dakota and Colorado. My longest trip was to the MARC National Convention in 1988 in St. Louis MO. This trip was

taken shortly after I purchased my car and the round trip was approximately 1400 miles. The people in our group included Ray Bragg and his father Bill, Werner and Jan Langenbach, Don and Donna Myhre, their daughter Donelle and her hus-


band Ed who drove our backup

vehicle. The trip went well except for highway construction, dirt roads and 105 degree temperatures.

The second longest trip to date was to St. Charles Illinois. A round trip of about 950 miles. On this trip I was accompanied by my brother in law Tom Peterson, Dave and Neal Anderson, Eldon, Joan and Deb Frisk and her friend Kristy, Brian Jensen and Dick Punchard.

My other driving consists of driving in weddings, driving the elderly in parades and just every day driving. You can see how I racked up 3530 miles to win the High Mileage Award in 1993. One of the parades that my car drew the most attention was the time "Spanky" McFarland of the Little Rascals fame rode in my rumble seat, in the Hopkins Raspberry Festival. With people jumping in front of the car to take pictures, it became rather exciting.

As you can see, although I have not had the pleasure of restoring a Model A, I most certainly have had a good time. Along the way my "A" has introduced me to many friends who, without I would never have been able to keep my car running. Some of those who have helped me are Richard Darling, Rollie Farr, John Fenske, Charlie Wienke and to many others that the list is too long to publish.

Very Important Information Which Will Effect Our Club Financially

Members,

In the past week Brooklyn Center School notified the Board that the discount we receive it being retracted to align our rent to meet the district policy. If we do nothing and continue to meet at the school the cost will increase from about \$1,100 per year to over \$3,500 per year. The board has already been brainstorming ideas on ways to keep our cost low and still meet the needs of the club however this matter will require a special meeting as the contract with the school needs to be signed soon in order to secure our dates or decide on an alternate strategy. We are very interested in any ideas you may have however time is of essence and decisions need to be made quickly so if you have ideas please contact a board member soon.


Tour Detroit from a Ford Model A

Highland Park-based Antique Touring is launching a new kind of tour for the Motor City. Tour participants can expect to learn about the city's automotive history in specific locations and on the road. In a 1930 Model A Phaeton, the tour starts at the Piquette Avenue Ford Plant and rides to Belle Isle, with information about the Packard Plant, the former Fisher Body site, and Milwaukee Junction along the way. Soon, they hope to add a tour of the historic Boston-Edison neighborhood. Space is limited to just four passengers per tour, and tickets run \$65. Antique Touring founder Lisa Stolarski bought the car earlier this year and the paint and engine are original. Some recent upgrades include brighter headlights, turn signals, and brake lights."I live in Highland Park and want to create a social enterprise that will benefit our community so I looked to the old Ford Building on Woodward Avenue for inspiration," said Stolarski. "Henry Ford raised the expectations of the American working class and contributed tremendously to the concept of the American Dream.
