O COME, O COME EMMANUEL

November 30th is an important day in the Christian year- the beginning of Advent. Advent (from the Latin words *advenire*- "to come to" and *adventus* - "to arrive") is the period of hopeful waiting and preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. It begins on the 4th Sunday before Christmas (the Sunday nearest November 30), and ends on Christmas Eve. The primary color of Advent is purple- the color of repentance and fasting as well as the color of royalty. Advent is an opportunity for Christians everywhere to consider the wonder and awe of our Creator choosing to come into the world as a helpless child- a child who would save us.

What will Christmas be for you this year? I pray that you are able to make positive, lasting memories with loved ones. I pray that you are filled with the joy of the season. But most of all, I pray that you will encounter Jesus Christ in a way you have yet to experience. We read the Hallmark greeting cards that say "Jesus is the reason for the season", and we nod, smile, and go on about our day. But, despite their knack for syrupy language, the greeting card industry got this one right. Jesus IS the reason for the season.

Rampant consumerism doesn't bring us any closer to God; focusing on the coming of the Messiah in Bethlehem does. The reason Jesus came into the world ("Word made flesh") was to reveal God's grace. Have you experienced that grace this season? This month, come to church- Sunday morning, Sunday evening, Christmas Eve- and experience the reason for Christmas. May God bless you and those dear to you this Advent season!

JANUARY- A SEASON OF PRAYER AND FASTING

A great thing will happen in January! On Sunday, January 4th, the sermon focus will be on the power of prayer and fasting. We will talk about what fasting IS and "bust some of the myths" of what fasting ISN'T. Then we will begin a 2-week period of prayer and fasting. Everybody in the church will be encouraged to participate as God leads you.

That time of prayer and fasting will be brought to a close in a powerful way. From 5PM, Friday January 16th through 5PM Saturday, January 17th, we will host our 3rd annual 24-Hour Prayer Vigil. You will be given the opportunity to sign up to lead and/or attend one or more hours of prayer. The hours will rotate back and forth between the sanctuary and the chapel. Communion will be available each hour.

Then, on Sunday, January 18th, we will celebrate Dedication Sunday. Late this month, each household will receive a packet about committing our time, talent and tithes to God. And on Dedication Sunday, at all three services, we will all have the opportunity to bring our Dedication Card to the front and place it on the altar. Please keep this powerful and important time in the life of our congregation in your prayers!


• **Sunday, November 30- "No Room!"** (Luke 2:6-7) Vinnie Innkeeper is cast as "the bad guy".





The Beatitudes: Developing Spiritual Character

PARKING

By now, you've probably noticed that the parking area on 3rd Street just outside the Church Office has been re-painted. The goals that the Trustees have for that area are:

- 1. to offer two spots (all the way to the west) that are reserved for vehicles that have lifts which need extra space to load and unload
- 2. to offer a few parking spots that are designated for people who need to park as close as possible.

The nine spots in that stretch that are to the east ARE marked (on the pavement) as "handicapped" spots. They are, however, not "legal" handicapped spots, due to space requirements. Therefore, what the Trustees ask is that, if you HAVE a handicapped parking designation for your vehicle OR you simply need to park that close...please park there! On the other hand, if you are able/comfortable to park across the street and walk over, then please save the other spots for folks who need them! Parking is CERTAINLY a problem here at AUMC- and what a GREAT problem to have!


