Tidings from Timothy

You may have made resolutions at the New Year. How are you doing with those New Year resolutions? It seems that many of them are not worth much. I tell you what, this morning I will give you a "Resolution for Life" straight out of the Bible. That way, you won't have to worry about what to resolve each week, just follow this morning's Scripture and you will be set.

The Holy Spirit of Promise (Ephesians 1:13)

In our text for this study, Paul speaks of Christians who "were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise." Just what is this "Holy Spirit of promise"? It is simply amazing when you start reading the comments of those who endeavor to explain this statement. They cite a dozen other passages searching for the "Holy Spirit of promise," all of them seemingly having never heard of Acts 2:38-39. If the "promise of the Holy Spirit" in this passage does not connect with the "Holy Spirit of promise" in our text then perhaps nothing does. Listen again to Peter's statement, "And Peter said unto them, Repent ye, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ unto the remission of your sins; and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For to you is the promise, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call unto Him" (Acts 2:38-39 ASV).

It is the promised Spirit. Isaiah wrote, "Until the spirit be poured upon us from on high, and the wilderness be a fruitful field, and the fruitful field be counted for a forest" (Isa. 32:15). And Zechariah wrote, "And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him, as one mourneth for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn" (Zech. 12:10). Later we are informed, "And we are His witnesses of these things; and so is also the Holy Ghost, whom God hath given to them that obey Him" (Acts 5:32).

But what does it mean that we are "sealed"? The margin reads "confirmed." The meaning seems to be that we are marked as genuine. God is stamping His obedient children spiritually and thereby saying, "This confirms that this one is My child."

But "Is it possible for me to know that I have this seal? How do I know that I have this seal? How do I know that I have this Holy Spirit of promise?" In order to answer this question, let us look at a similar one. "How do I know that I have a human spirit?" There are two ways that we may know this. One is because God tells me that I do. In Genesis 2:7, we are told, "And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." Paul speaks of us having both a body and a spirit in which we can glorify God in I Corinthians 6:20. And in explaining inspiration, Paul asked, "For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him?" (I Cor. 2:11). Thus I can know that I have a human spirit because God tells me that I do.

Secondly, I can know that I have a human spirit by the evidence. James states, "The body without the spirit is dead" (James 2:26). Thus the fact that there is life within our body is evidence that we have a spirit within us; otherwise, our body would be dead.

Now, back to the first question: I can also know that I have this "Holy Spirit of promise" in the same two ways. First, God tells me that I do (Acts 2:38-39; Acts 5:32, our text; and in II Corinthians 1:22, Paul also writes, "Who hath also sealed us, and given us the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts." So God has told me that I am sealed with this Holy Spirit of promise. And in the second place, I can know that I have this "Holy Spirit of promise" by the evidence or by the fruit that I bear. Paul spoke of this fruit in Galatians 5:22-23: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance...." The "fruit of the Spirit" cannot be produced unless you have the Spirit. The law of kinds, as with the good/bad trees and their fruit, demonstrates this fact. Read and study carefully Matthew 7:15-20. Thus the fruit of the Spirit produced in my life is evidence that I have been "sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise." —Paul M. Wilmoth (edited for space)
