## LAMBS GROVE CITY NEWS

**SNOW PARKING** – 69.10 SNOW REMOVAL. From November 1 to April 1 of each year, no vehicle shall be parked or left standing upon any of the public streets of the City when snow is in the forecast or when one inch or more of snow has accumulated.

Your vehicle may be towed if this is an issue. There is also an ordinance covering not pushing snow into the street. Keep this in mind as you are clearing your driveways.

**BURNING LEAVES** Burning is allowed in Lambs Grove. The City has an agreement with Newton Schools not to burn leaves during school hours - 7:35 am to 3:40 pm. Please respect this agreement.

No fires may be left unattended. Fires cannot be allowed to smolder overnight. Respect your neighbor's comfort, do not burn if smoke from your fire will blow into their homes. Fires are not allowed on city property or in city streets. Clear the street in front of your property. Burning of garbage is prohibited. Keep in mind that free composting is available at the Newton Landfill.

**TREES** We have reports of both Ash Borer and Oak Wilt. Please consider inspecting the trees on your property and arranging for removal of dangerous, dead or low hanging branches, this will save you money in the long run before they cause any property damage. When you replace a tree on your property not only are you removing carbon dioxide from the air but you are increasing your property value.

STREET CARE Much of our tax money is spent on street and storm sewer maintenance and repair.

Help the City control cost by clearing leaves and debris from the street in front of your property.

It is very important to keep storm sewer intakes open from accumulated debris.

**PARKING** There is no parking on grass. See Chapter 52 of the City Ordinances for further assistance. Parking is allowed only on one side of the street, check for the No Parking signs when in doubt.

# TRASH AND RECYCLING PICK UP TUESDAY NIGHTS

### Please have your items at the curb by 7:00 pm

**Lambs Grove** is responsible for your trash and recyclables collection. We ask you to please recycle.

What is accepted when you recycle?

#### **Plastic**

### Only Food and Hygiene Containers with twist cap or lids are accepted

Examples of accepted plastic-laundry detergent, shampoo, milk, soda, and food containers with twist off caps.

#### **Paper Products**

Examples of accepted paper-newspaper, junk mail, school paper, and <u>flattened</u> paper board boxes- such as cereal, pasta, cracker, etc.

#### <u>Tin</u>

#### **Household Food and Hygiene cans only**

Examples of accepted tin and aluminum-soup, vegetable, fruit, soda, food and hygiene cans.

#### **Flattened Corrugated Cardboard**

Examples of corrugated cardboard has the honey comb thickness-- flattened shipping carton and small appliance boxes.

## NON-RECYCLABLE-- PLEASE DO NOT PLACE THESE MATERIALS IN YOUR RECYCLING CONTAINERS

Examples of Non-Recyclable Plastic-toys, hangers, plastic wrap and bags, plastic that does not have a twist off lid, food and dog food bags, styrofoam, drinking cups, and straws.

Examples of Non-Recyclable Glass-light bulbs, dishes, cookware, anything ceramic,

Examples of Non-Recyclable Metal-pots, pans, cookware, aluminum foil.

Examples of Non-Recyclable Paper-meat wrapping paper, tissues, paper towels, books, wrapping paper, non-flatten boxes Examples of Non-Recyclable Corrugated Cardboard-tubes, plastic covered or lined, boxes that include Styrofoam.

Reminders NO plastic bags are accepted- except bags with shredded paper. Any bags containing materials other than shredded paper in the recycling bin will be left.
