Below is the statement from the Catholic Bishops' Conference. On Wednesday Parliament passed into law the Regulations governing many aspects of activity in the whole of England until **Wednesday, 2 December**.

"These Regulations prohibit the gathering of people for communal worship in churches and other religious buildings.

Despite profound misgivings it is important that we, as responsible citizens, observe these Regulations, which have the force of law:"

Daily Prayer Cardinal Nichols has suggested a shared moment of national prayer at 6pm each day and for us to observe 21 November the Feast of Christ the King as a day of prayer for ending the pandemic.

The Holy Communion preparation has been suspended at church. Mrs Holden will prepare all candidates within school adhering to COVID safety regulations. The date for receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation has been cancelled due to lockdown. The original date of First Holy Communion (19/20 Dec) will be reviewed nearer the time. If places of worship have been opened by then, Fr Jim would like the children to make their First Holy Communion on the original date.
