


Every once in while, it is so important that I thank the many volunteers at our parish and all the amazing things that people do



In the Gospel today, Jesus says if we are trustworthy in small things, we will also be trustworthy in great things. If we are dishonest in small things, we will be dishonest in great things.

What does this mean for you being a child? One of the things it means taking care of the things your parents have given you or provided for you. It would be like putting your shoes away instead (being trustworthy) of throwing them wherever you take them off (not being trustworthy). Sharing is another way of using your belongings as God asks us to do.
