THE FEAST OF THE NATIVITY

Christ is Born! Glorify Him!

The present Feast, commemorating the Nativity in the flesh of our Lord Jesus Christ, was established by the Church. Its origin goes back to The time of the Apostles. In the Apostolic Constitutions (Section 3, 13) it says, "Brethren, 'observe the feast days; and first of all, the Birth of Christ. . . ." In another place it also says, "Celebrate the day of the Nativity of Christ, on which unseen grace is given man by the birth of the Word of God from the Virgin Mary for the salvation of the world."

On this day, the Church also commemorates the Magi and the Shepherds. The Nativity was revealed to

the Magi by a wondrous star. Saint John Chrysostom and Saint Theophylactus, commenting on Saint Matthew's Gospel, say that this was no ordinary star. Rather, it was "a divine and angelic power that appeared in the form of a star." Entering the house where the Infant lay, the Magi "fell down, and worshipped Him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented Him gifts: gold, and frankincense, and myrrh" (Mt. 2:11).

The Shepherds of Bethlehem in the stillness of midnight (Wisdom of Solomon 18:14-15), the proclamation of the birth of the Savior of the world was heard by three shepherds watching their flocks by night. An angel of the Lord (St Cyprian says this was Gabriel) came before them and said: "Fear not: for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, Who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:10-11). The humble shepherds were the first to offer worship to Him Who condescended to assume the form of a humble servant for the salvation of mankind.

Troparion — Tone 4

Your Nativity, O Christ our God, Has shone to the world the Light of wisdom! For by it, those who worshipped the stars, Were taught by a Star to adore You, The Sun of Righteousness, And to know You, the Orient from on High. O Lord, glory to You!

Kontakion — Tone 3

Today the Virgin gives birth to the Transcendent One, And the earth offers a cave to the Unapproachable One! Angels with shepherds glorify Him! The wise men journey with a star! Since for our sake the Eternal God was born as a Little Child!

The Feast of Nativity is a three (3) Day Feast, followed by the Afterfeast (Post feast) of the Nativity

An afterfeast (also known as *post feast*) is a period of time following certain major feasts of the during which the feast continues to be celebrated. The liturgical life of the Church reflects this extended celebration by continuing to express the themes of the feast in the divine services celebrated during the afterfeast. The afterfeast begins on the day after the feast and concludes on the leavetaking of the feast. The period of the afterfeast varies from feast to feast. The afterfeast for the Nativity includes the following commemorations:

—January 8: Second Day of Nativity, Synaxis of the Mother of God

—January 9, Third Day of the Nativity Holy Protomartyr and Archdeacon Stephen

—January 10, Afterfeast of the Nativity of Christ. The 20,000 Martyrs of Nicomedia,

—January 11, Afterfeast of the Nativity of Christ. The 14,000 Infants (Holy Innocents) slain by Herod at Bethlehem (1st c.).

—January 12, Saturday after Nativity and before Theophany.
