August 12, 2018 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time John 6:41-51

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Peace! In our Sunday gospel, I think Jesus is saying to everyone, "Listen to yourselves!" The crowd is heckling him and pushing back against His claim to be 'living bread come down from heaven'. His response to the murmuring campaign from the crowd is to suggest that each person take a moment for him/her self to reflect upon what Jesus is doing. Jesus is saying, "Think over all that I have said and done up to this point in ministry: Decide for yourselves. But explain me before you reject my mission." Hoping to appeal to their shared Hebrew scripture background, Jesus combines a quote from Isaiah 54:13 "They shall all be taught by God" and Jeremiah 31:33 "I will place my law within them, and write it upon their hearts". Again, I think Jesus is saving, "Listen to yourself." I've sure been told that. Maybe someone was trying to get a point across to me, and I was so hung up on some detail of what they said or who they were, that I was not really hearing anything. Until finally, a breakthrough occurs, and it hits me, 'Oh, that is what you mean'. We can be deaf to certain ideas because of prejudice. We can be deaf to certain people, who we are hardened to because of some past hurtful experience. On top of that deafness, we can even 'read' into what they say, injecting our own selfserving agendas and issues.

Maybe, it is just simply WHO, is saying it? In this case, we are hung up on the messenger, not hearing the message at all. Imagine a person pointing up at a star in the sky, saying, "Look'. If we only stare at the person's arm, or shirt or watch, we miss the specific sight intended and the greater view. The prejudice of Jesus' crowd who knows some of His upbringing is like this. They reject Him saying anything about 'heaven' or 'heaven come down' because they say 'Wait, we know you and your family: your nothing special from heaven." Well, their prejudice hardens them from hearing any message. It is their loss! This is just like, Jesus' hometown mob rejecting him back in Mark 6:3, because they said "We know you. You are not preaching anything to us." But Jesus is faithful, and he keeps trying to break through our closed ears and hearts to speak His Life-giving Word to us. I imagine Jesus' exasperation at trying *and* trying to get to us. But again, he never gives up on us. Like when he prays over Jerusalem in Matthew 23:37, "Jerusalem, how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her voung under her wings....." He wants to speak *through* our personal noise to reach our hearts. I remember a great line in the George Clooney movie, Michael Clayton, when as a lawyer and friend, he was desperately trying to help get through to an oblivious friend for his own good, and he said, "Arthur, how do I talk to you, as a partner, a child, an accomplice? How, because I really need you to hear me?"

What do we miss from God, because we reject His messenger? Discerning God at work behind or through all people, places and things, leads us to live fully His Will and Way for our lives. But we have to be open, wise and always 'seeking God'. Perhaps when we are tempted to reject someone or some statement, we need to stop and listen a little closer, first 1) by ignoring who is saying it-write down what they say, let go of WHO said it, and 2) by not jumping to conclusions or going off on our personal rants and 3) by listening closely to the 'bigger voice' of God- teaching and leading through all possible means. Even a broken clock is right two times a day! God may be speaking to us, even from an unlikely source!
