
16. And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger.

The AFBC choir has been "on the road again." We recently completed our fall tour of the Oklahoma - Texas Panhandle churches; consisting of fourteen concerts in thirteen days. We had a wonderful tour with several being saved, good concerts, no bus trouble, and only minor personal mishap! To all who ministered to our physical needs while on tour, we extend a hearty THANK YOU!

I must admit to some "pondering" concerning our tours; this was the fifteenth tour I've completed in six years with the Bible School. Every tour represents an intense concentration of hard work on the part of the choir and the school - as well as on the churches who feed, house, and support us. What is the real reason for these tours! Who benefits from the tours?

First, good Christian music with a message can do three things; praise God directly, edify (encourage) the believer, and witness to the lost. As a choir, we endeavor to sing a variety of inspirational gospel music with a strong message and to do so with the anointing of the Holy Spirit. Our desire is that the songs we sing will minister to others by uplifting fellow Christians and testifying to lost souls. We also want to minister to God; praising and glorifiying Him as we worship Him in spirit and in truth. We want people to enjoy our concerts, to be refreshed in the Lord, and to leave the service with more of the Lord and His peace and love than they came with.

The tours, however, are beneficial for more reasons than these. Choir tour gives the students a chance to minister to others which they may have never before had. They learn what it means to pray and carry burden for a service and for people they have never met. They learn that anything done for the Lord is worthy of our best effort. In turn, they learn the sacrifice, of time, energy, and personal desires this "best effort" sometimes requires. They learn that working for God means "self" last- and that may mean singing though I feel sick, smiling even though I'm too tired to, and visiting with people when I'd really rather just be silent. They also learn

the wonderful ways the Lord rewards His people for this kind of faithfulness and commitment. Seeing someone in a concert respond to the invitation and come forward to repent and be converted - and knowing you've had a part in ministering to that person...well, that's worth any sacrifice!

Choir tour also accomplishes other things. When the choir comes to your church, we get to meet you and you get to meet the choir members. This is good "ground-work" because one of these young people might be working in your church as a youth director or Sunday School teacher; one of them might counsel your child at Youth Camp or teach him in VBS; one might hold a revival in your church someday, or even be your pastor in the future. Mutually getting acquainted is important you could be laying a foundation for these future relationships.

Finally, choir tour helps us at the Bible School "keep in touch" with the people of our movement. We realize that you probably can't be with us in Baxter Springs on a daily basis; so choir tour brings a little bit of the Bible School to you. We pray that as we come, you will be able to "catch" some of the excitement, the joy, the vision of Bible School. Perhaps you will be challenged to invest some of yourself in the school; to invest more of your prayers, support, loyalty, and interest than you ever have before.

Time for the next choir tour is just a couple months away. We are already preparing muscially and spiritually to make it a successful trip. Remember that, as we come your way we've come with a purpose! Enjoy the choir, hear their message, be blessed and be challenged.

For we know that our (your) labour is not in vain in the Lord.

One sows, another waters, still another reaps at harvestbut God gives the increase. We know His word will not return to Him empty (void) but it will accomplish whatever mission it was sent out to fulfill.

Dean of Men Danny Robinson SIX WAYS TO HELP YOUR PASTOR

One of the most difficult responsibilties in Christian service today is that of being a pastor. And it's getting more difficult all the time. People today are becoming more independent and more self-centered. Everyone wants to do his own thing.

To certain people, the "shepherd of the sheep" has become a byword and they are beginning to depend on services outside of the church for spiritual help and growth. This is a pity; for they need the church-and the church needs them.

1. Tell your pastor he can count on you.

One of the most difficult tasks of a pastor is trying to get people to do something. Pastors have heard all the excuses. "Sorry, we will be gone out of town." "That's the night our women's group meets." "I have to be at a school activity that night." "I've just got to get my sleep; I'm too tired"; etc.

On the other hand, I have heard pastors say, "There's no

one like Bill and Mary. I can count on them."

2. Be faithful at all the church services.

Ladies, you know what it's like to prepare a good meal and then have no one show up to eat it, or for your husband to come home late when the food is all cold. If you haven't had this experience, let me tell you it's disappointing.

Pastors face this type of disappointment very often. They will work hard praying and preparing a sermon, and then

just a handful of people will show up to share it!

If your pastor knows you're going to be there, he will make an extra effort to prepare something just for you. Be sure to be there to enjoy it.

3. Look for his good qualities and tell him.

I am not talking about flattery. I'm talking about sincere encouragement.

Pastors are human and they can get discouraged. They can feel dejected like anyone else. You and I both know what a little encouragement will do. It will go a long way in helping someone be the type of person they should be.

Yes, even your pastor needs encouragement! You will be amazed at the many good qualities you can find in him when you begin to look.

4. Don't talk behind his back.

This can hurt! Besides tearing down the pastor, your talk involves others. The young people get impressions. Others form opinions, and communications between your pastor and his people is broken down.

When you speak about your pastor, say only good things. If he does make a mistake, why not be a part of the solution rather than a part of the problem! Remember tht he is a man of God, and determine that you will not have a part in destroying his position and his influence with your tongue.

5. Be concerned about his children.

You've heard people talk. The "PK", preacher's kids, or "TO," theologian's offspring, are expected to be something special. Actually they have their own problems. They live in a glass bowl, and are subject to criticism more than any other group of children, yet they would like to be treated the way other children are. Help the pastor with his children by being concerned for them. Never complain to him about his children, but show them the same friendliness and helpfulness you show other children.

Pray for him each day.

The pastor is always there when you need him. He is trying his best to help you. Why not try your best to help him! There's no better way to do this than to pray for him and his family every day.

Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. ARTICLE VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentence toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Santification of the Spirit, soul and Body. A second definite

work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.

Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9. Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

Sanctification is a truth that needs to be preached, practiced, and lived; yet it is almost a forgotten message. Whenever the scripture mentions sin, it is talking about the sin nature that we were born with. We are not responsible for this sin nature that we were born with, so we can't repent for it. But through a thorough surrender, 100 fold, in full consecration to do God's will we can be cleansed through the cleansing blood fo Christ. I John 1:7-10 "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ouselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned. we make him a liar, and his word is not in us." "The blood of Jesus Christ cleanseth from all sin" is speaking of the sin nature. Verse 8 "If we say that we have no sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." This is talking about if we deny the sin nature that we were born with then it plainly says the truth is not in us. Now the 9th verse talks about sins. "If we confess our sins, he" Jesus "is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." In verse 10, "If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us." This is denying that we ever committed a sin. Romans 3:23 "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." We were all born in sin and are all sinners until we repent with a Godly sorrow for the sins that we have committed, and believe in our hearts that Jesus has forgiven our sins. Acts 3:19 "Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshings shall come from the presence fo the Lord." This is true conversion. This has to take place before you can be sanctified. Then you are a candidate for Sanctification. Many say it is a controversial message. Jesus was the most controversial preacher that ever came along. Jesus said many times in his teaching and preaching: Matthew 5:38-39, "Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also." Now this was very controversial to what they had been taught. I have often wondered just how would I react if I was really put to the test. I was working for a man one time and I said something that made him very mad. He was a man that was well built, much heavier and stronger than I. When he got mad and drew back his fist there was such a sweet calm feeling that came over me. I didn't defend myself at all and through the grace of Sanctifying cleansing blood of Christ I remained calm. He never hit me but I think if he had I could of turned the other cheek. I take no honor or praise to myself, only praise the Lord for His Sanctifying Grace.

Jesus taught Sanctification, Paul taught it and the twelve Apostles taught it. Many ministers talk about the born again Christian. What they are saying is that you are born again at salvation; which I don't believe the scripture teaches. I definitely believe in being born again. John 1:11-13 "He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave him power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God." I believe this scripture says to as many that received him in Salvation he gave them them power to become the sons of God. Son of God, being born of the Spirit, Spiritual Birth. John 3:6-8. "That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again. The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound therof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit." (Spiritual Birth) I believe that Jesus made it very plain what being born of the Spirit is, by using the wind to explain this truth of Spiritual Birth. You can't see the wind, you can't tell where it came from and where it went. You can't see the Spirit either. You can see the results of the wind but not the wind itself. Jesus said that in those born of the Spirit you can see the results of a spiritual birth, that comes when we are Sanctified. You may have a good experience in Salvation but you don't become Spiritual until the Spiritual Birth in Sanctification. Jesus said in John 3:3 "And Jesus answered and said unto him verily verily I say unto thee, except a man be born again, he cannot see the Kingdom of God." In Jesus sermon on the mount Matthew 5:8 "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God." Sanctification deals with the purity of the heart. It is necessary to be born again to see the Kingdom of God. Also it is very necessary to be in the first resurrection. Revelation 20:6 "Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection." If we are not sanctified we will not reign with Christ in the glorious 1000 year reign of peace.

Jesus prayed in John 17:9-21 "I pray not for the world, but for them which thou hast given me, for they are thine. And all mine are thine, and thine are mine; and I am glorified in them. And now I am no more in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to thee. Holy Father keep through thine own name those whom thou hast given me, that they may be one, as we are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in my name; those thou hast given me I have kept and none of them is lost, but the son of perdition; that the scripture might be fulfilled. And now I come to thee; and these things I speak in the world, that they might have my joy fulfilled in themselves in themselves. I have given them thy word; and the world hateth them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. I pray that thou shouldest not take them out of the world, but that thou shouldest keep them from the evil. They are not of the world even as I am not fo the world. Sanctify them through thy truth; thy word is truth. And as thou hast sent me into the world, even so have I also sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they might be also be sanctified through the truth. Neither pray I for these alone, but them also which shall believe on me through their word. That they may all be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they may also be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me."Aren't you glad that Jesus didn't leave us out in this prayer? Thank God!

Romas 5:1-2 "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ; by whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. "I had never heard a message of sanctification, but after I had been saved three weeks this experience became a reality in my life. I was on the way to the field to work driving a six horse team when the Lord sanctified me. I was trying to sing "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" and as I completely surrendered myself to God He sanctified me completely. I definitely felt the cleansing power of the blood of Christ go through my whole being. It was a definite experience. After you are sanctified there is a growth in holiness and in living a sanctified life. Jesus is going to present to himself a sanctified church without spot or wrinkle a glorious church. Let us strive to be worthy of being in this glorious church. God bless you.
