#### The Way of the Cross

Being able to find our way, being able to explore and navigate the world we live in is an essential survival skill. From the earliest periods of civilization, humanity looked up to the bright and beautiful stars of the skies for guidance, charted and mapped the known world, we invented instruments and devices that help us venture into new worlds and new possibilities. Modern life is no different, smart devices and applications help us plan and research everything from an everyday commute to work to space exploration. What about our faith? What are the things that help us navigate and find a way in our spiritual life? Today, as we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, we are reminded that the Cross is not merely something we venerate, wear on our bodies and adorn our churches and homes with, but also a precious symbol that guides our lives and shows us the way to God.

A second-century saint and apologist Justin Martyr tells us that the Cross is a symbol of how to live and navigate life as Christians. He brings to attention that the cross is made up of two bars — one vertical and one horizontal. The vertical bar of the Cross symbolizes our relationship with God — what we do, how we pray, how we seek to have a greater relationship and connection with God. But the cross is not complete without the horizontal bar which symbolizes and signifies our relationships with one another. This is the part that is extremely difficult to live, this is the part where we are likely to stumble. We do have faith and a desire to believe, our main struggle is how to take that belief and express it to one another. That is a difficult thing to do.

The problem is, we can't have one without the other. Often we hear people describing their spirituality as a personal relationship with God that has absolutely nothing to do with anything or anyone else. Even those of us that have an active presence in a parish life and worship might sometimes subconsciously see our attendance and participation in the liturgy

#### **VOTING MEMBERSHIP**

If you are not yet a <u>voting</u> member of the St. Mary Yettem Parish, you might want to consider membership. Some might ask what constitutes "membership in our church".

If you tell others, you are a "member of St. Mary Armenian Church in Yettem" it is understood that you have an allegiance to our church. That means you have a loyalty to attending here in Yettem. That usually also includes that you support the parish by your attendance and your physical and/or monetary contributions to her well-being.

"Voting Membership" takes this membership to another level. Voting membership is available to any member of the church that is at least eighteen years of age and who has been baptized or chrismated in the Armenian Church. It signifies a higher commitment to attend an annual meeting to be included in the decisions to keep our church strong and to *possibly* hold an elected position. A voting member also pays an annual dues as part of their pledge. The number of voting members we have determines how many delegates we have at the diocesan level.

#### HONORING FATHER VARTANS 50TH

Earlier this year on May 27<sup>th</sup> a banquet was held to honor Archpriest Father Vartan Kasparian's ordination to the Sacred Order of the Priesthood which took place here in Yettem on September 8-9, 1973. This celebration was scheduled then to fit into the Diocesan calendar and was a beautiful event attended by many to celebrate fifty years of his dedicated service here and in the Diocese as a priest.

On Sunday September 10<sup>th</sup>, which is the closest Sunday to his actual ordination fifty years ago, Father Vartan has accepted the invitation of St. Mary Parish Priest Mashdots Keshishian and the St. Mary Parish Council to deliver the sermon and message. This is especially significant in many ways and also quite rare that a priest is still active in the same community that he was ordained fifty years later.

Teaching for ten years in the Los Angeles area, John Kasparian began theological studies at Claremont School. In 1964, Bishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate of the Western Diocese, ordained him a subdeacon. This was followed in 1967 by his ordination to the full diaconate by Bishop Elisha Simonian. From 1967 until 1969, Deacon John served as the Spiritual Administrator at St. James Sacramento and then as pastoral assistant from 1970 until 1972 at St. James Los Angeles.

To further his Armenian and religious studies, Deacon John traveled to Jerusalem where he enrolled in the Armenian Seminary of St. James in 1972. Upon his return to the United States, he was designated as the Spiritual Administrator for both Sts. Sahag-Mesrob Parish of Reedley and St. Mary Parish of Yettem. On September 9, 1973, he was ordained a priest of the Armenian Church by the Primate Bishop Vatche Hovsepian, who renamed him Father Vartan. For the following year, he served as the parish priest of St. Mary Yettem, and as the visiting priest for Sts. Sahag-Mesrob parish. In 1974, he was assigned exclusively to St. Mary Yettem.

Thus, began his long history with St. Mary Yettem that we will again mark on Sunday, September 10, 2023. Please join us!

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## Ladies Society Featured Member Margie Lynn Davidian

I was born on November 7, 1955, at Alta District Hospital in Dinuba, the youngest child of Sark and Sylvia (Derderian) Davidian. My grandparents were Arshavir and Zarouhie Davidian and Yervant and Makrouhie Derderian. My siblings are Charlie and Sark Jr. Being the youngest and only girl, of course I was very spoiled.

Our house was on Avenue 384, only about 1.5 miles west of our church. My dad grew cotton, oranges, nectarines, Thompson grapes which were made into raisins, and tomatoes. Everyone in the family helped with the crops. Cotton season was exciting because I could stomp the cotton in the trailer before it

was taken to the cotton gin over on Ben Maddox. Raisin season was when I got to drive the tractor while my brothers would toss rolled raisins onto the trailer for delivery to mom and grandma for boxing.

Tomatoes were Dad's main crop. Summer vacation meant working in our tomato packing shed, right next to our house so no excuse to be late for work. I would wake up, get dressed, maybe have breakfast, get outside, start sweeping the shed and getting boxes ready for tomatoes to be packed. My responsibilities grew to include assistant floor lady to my mom and helping my dad with payroll. The best part was when I drove the forklift.

I attended Yettem Elementary, Cutler Elementary, and Orosi High School. I participated in many clubs and activities in high school, including student government. I played alto saxophone in the OHS marching band and was president of the band my senior year. I graduated in 1973. Next came COS, where I received an AA in 1976. On to Reedley College for an AS in 1978 in their dental assisting program. I worked as a dental assistant for about seven years. Then I applied to the Dental Hygiene Program at Fresno City College. I graduated from FCC in 1987 with another AS and received the Dental Hygiene Program's Leadership and Professionalism Award. I started my first hygienist job with Dr. Larry Farsakian in Visalia. When Larry moved to Chicago, he sold the practice to Dr. Gerald Schneider in 1988. I worked with Dr Schneider for thirty years until I retired at the end of December 2018.

Church is a big part of my life. I was baptized at St. Mary Yettem in 1956 and have been attending there ever since. I remember going to Sunday School in the little house that was where the hall is now. Everyone started out in the living room, then went to a bedroom or the kitchen depending on what grade you were in. Armenian School on Saturdays was also held in the little house for a while, then moved to the Presbyterian Church down the road across from Garo's Grocery Store.

My mother told me many years ago, "You are never too busy or too tired to work for our Church." I hear those words often in my head. Through the years, I taught Sunday School, was active in ACYO in many capacities including Chairman, sang in the choir, worked on the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Book, served on the Ways and Means Committee, and Parish Council. I was delegate to Diocesan Assemblies for both Parish Council and Ladies' Society. My mother paid my dues to Ladies' Society in 1977 when she decided it was time for me to become a member. Since then, I have held many offices, served on numerous committees, and helped my cousin Marguerite Sheklian with the Ladies' Society Cookbook. I received the Hye Spirit Medal in 2019.

I love to barbecue, bake, garden, and try any kind of recipe once.

I met Kathy Ashford in 1995. We've been together ever since. We married on May 6, 2015. We live in Visalia with our two dogs Bodi and Wilson. We enjoy playing pickle ball, camping, and spending time in Cayucos at Kathy's family beach house.



and Badarak as something we do for ourselves. We might think that we are here on Sundays so we can pray, spend some time in the spiritual environment of the church. But that is not what the church and liturgy are truly about. A mere glance into the liturgical hymns and prayers of Badarak is sufficient to reveal that we are here to pray for the peace of the entire world, for the healing of every form of human suffering and pain. We are here to pray for each other, to pray for the person next to us on the pews.

We do this because we can't continue our spiritual journey to the top of the cross and to God without passing through the horizontal bar. We can't get there without loving and embracing the people around us, without forgiving everyone in our lives. We do this because that is precisely what we were taught by Christ. A young man came to Jesus and asked, "Teacher, what is the greatest law of Moses?" (Matthew 22:36). And Christ answered him, saying: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39).

The Holy Cross is recognized as the symbol of salvation for all Christians from as early as the time of the Apostles. The cross is a source of great national pride for us. For over the centuries, Armenians have borne Christ's cross with faith, hope, and love. What was once an instrument of torture and death, comparable to the modern electric chair, became for us Christians the symbol of salvation, and victory over death. Amen.
