Welcome to the Willette church of Christ, where you will find the Bible as our only rule for faith and practice. We seek to speak where the Bible speaks and to be silent where the Bible is silent. We want to call Bible things by Bible names and do Bible things in Bible ways.

Jesus said, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost" (Matthew 28:18-20). Our evangelistic efforts include several local and foreign mission works listed on the back of this bulletin. The home congregation is the most important work. Therefore, every month, we spend time door knocking, visiting, and helping our local community. We have a large benevolent building that operates every Tuesday from 8:30-12:30, which offers free clothes and other items to anyone in need. Our primary foreign work is found in Andhra Pradesh, India, where Brother *Jack Honeycutt* serves as our full time mission coordinator. We are also blessed to have a full time prison ministry with services conducted each Sunday from 1:00-3:00. Brother *Tim McHenry* is our regular preacher. In addition to preaching, he teaches classes and is involved in many works here at Willette. Our associate preachers *Mark West* and *Ben Smith* preach, teach classes, minister in the nursing home, coordinate our visitation teams, and work with our Bible camp and youth in general. In addition, we have a radio program on 102.1 FM that airs each weekday around 12:15. If anyone has special needs our Christian Counselor, Dale Sadler, is ready to help by calling 615-513-3642

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

Tidings from Timothy

We all want the same thing. You want the best for your family and secondarily for your fellow man. Not only are our goals the same in general, but God has designated that there are times when all are equal and must do the same thing. I want us to think about that this morning and realize that it goes further than just “death and taxes.” Tonight, we make a special study of the Lord’s Supper.

Food Groups: I wanted to thank the groups for doing such a good job with the Woodard funeral. The family was really appreciative and there was so much food!

Vacation Church: When we go on vacation, you can still keep the Lord in mind. We have books you can check out in the Library such as “Churches of Christ in the USA” that will tell you where most congregations are. I am fair at looking up brethren in any given area as well. So if you need to travel and are looking for a place to go to church, just ask or go to the library and we will fix you up.

Redemption Through the Blood

In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace” (Eph. 1:7).

Thank God for the blood of Christ! For those who understand its power and the need for it, it is one of the most powerful things in the universe. “What can wash away my sins? Nothing but the blood of Jesus!” Many people have a great objection to the word “blood,” but I have a great objection to those people. If we remove the blood of Christ, we leave the New Testament without a theme and without a purpose. The church of our Lord is rock-bottomed, blood-bought and heaven-sent (Matt. 16:18, Acts 20:28, Eph. 5:23).

“Redemption” is a releasing by the payment of a ransom. It means that we have been bought back and brought back from sin and made free. Redemption, along with all other spiritual blessings, is “in Christ.” This redemption is through the blood. Peter wrote, “Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot: Who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you, Who by him do believe in God, that raised him up from the dead, and gave him glory; that your faith and hope might be in God” (I Pet. 1:18-21).

Most religious people say that the blood of Jesus saves. But how does it save? We must know how the remedy is applied to benefit from it. How, when, and where do we reach the cleansing blood?

The blood of Christ washes away sin (Rev. 1:5). The blood of Christ is “for the remission of sins” (Matt. 26:28). The blood of Christ brings redemption and forgiveness (Eph. 1:7). The blood of Christ justifies (Rom. 5:9). The blood of Christ purchased the church (Acts 20:28). And we are told by the writer of Hebrews that without blood, there is no remission of sins (Heb. 9:22; 10:4).

The Bible also teaches that baptism washes away sins. (Acts 22:16). Baptism is “for the remission of sins” (Acts 2:38). Baptism “doth also now save us” (I Pet. 3:21). And in Paul’s letter, under discussion in these articles, he writes of the church having been “washed” (Eph. 5:25-27). This is an obvious allusion to baptism. There are either two ways of receiving these blessings, or there is some connection between the blood of Christ and baptism. Let’s look at this connection.

The blood of Christ was shed in His death (John 19:34). We are baptized into Christ and into His death (Rom. 6:3). Baptism is a likeness of His death, burial and resurrection (Rom. 6:1-5). Note that Romans 6:17-18 says that when we “obey from the heart that form of doctrine” we are then “made free from sin.” So the order is obeyed?then freed! Read Romans 3:21-26 which shows that the redemption was provided in Christ, and that it was such that enabled God to be just while justifying those who believe in His Son. In Hebrews 9:22 we are told “without shedding of blood, there is no remission of sins.” And it is equally true that without baptism, there is no coming into contact with the blood!

What washes away my sins? Answer: The blood of Christ (Rev. 1:5). When does the blood of Christ wash away my sins? Answer: When I am baptized (Acts 22:16). What brings remission of sins? Answer: The blood of Christ (Matt. 26:28). When does the blood of Christ bring remission of sins? When I “repent and be baptized for the remission of sins” (Acts 2:38). By what am I justified or saved? Answer: The blood (Rom. 5:9). When am I justified by the blood? Answer: When I “obey from the heart that form of doctrine” and I am baptized into Christ which “doth also now save us” (I Pet. 3:21, Rom. 6:1-5; 17-18).

Those who teach salvation apart from baptism are eliminating the blood of Christ which is contacted in baptism in order that our sins might be washed away, remitted, and forgiven. If you have never been baptized in water “for the remission of sins,” then you have not received forgiveness and redemption through the blood! Our redemption cost so great a price?the blood of Christ. This is the supreme evidence of the “riches of His grace” (Eph. 1:7). See also Hebrews 9:12. The measure of what God does for us is nothing less than the limitless wealth of His loving favor. Who can fully comprehend the amazing grace of God? “Amazing grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost, but now am found, was blind, but now I see.” In the words of Paul, “Thanks be unto God for His unspeakable (priceless) gift!” (II Cor. 9:15). –Paul Wilmoth
