


Minutes 11/04/2015

The GSSN met on Wednesday, Nov. 4, 2015, at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV. President John Anderson called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM & led in pledging allegiance to the flag. He welcomed all. 62 signed in including one new member. There was a moment of silence in remembrance of Rick Young who died at the previous weekend outing. Rick had been handling the raffles recently. John then asked for a motion to approve the minutes for Oct. as published in the HighGrader. Morris Seguin made such a motion & Merck Black seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous & motion was approved. Then Mark Hedges gave the Treasurer's Report. Pam Goulder made a motion to accept the report as given & Bob McBain seconded the motion. Vote again was unanimous and the motion was approved. There was no new business. Old business consisted of the upcoming Gold Show, being held this year at the Cashman Center (April 27 - 28). Volunteers were requested to sign up.

Then John turned the meeting over to George N. for the election process. He went through the slate:

and Ron Raduenz. He asked if there were any other nominations for officers - there were none. He then asked for a motion to close
nominations. Ace Hunt made such motion which was seconded by Pam Goulder. Secretary Dolores Gee was asked to finalize process, which she did & ensuing vote was unanimously in favor. Then Ace Hunt closed nominations for vice president, which was
seconded by Morris. Vote was unanimous with one abstention. Next Mike Ameling and Ron Raduenz spoke briefly
about why they were running for the vice presidency. Since by show of hands 61 members were present, a quorum was constituted. Ace and Jake proposed that we go ahead with the vote since we did not have a copy of the membership list to go by. The vote
which followed was done by paper ballot which were passed out. A 10-minute break was taken during which time the ballots were
counted. When the meeting resumed, President John A. had Morris read the results: Out of 61 ballots (with one non-vote represented by a blank ballot) Mike received 33 votes and Ron received 27 votes, resulting in Mike's reelection. George made a motion to
accept the vote for vice president, and Kathey Gonsalez seconded the motion., Vote was unanimous and the motion was approved.

Morris thanked several members for their help.

Then George reminded anyone interested in coming to the next breakfast club meeting that it will be held 9AM Nov. 10th at Jokers Wild. All were invited. The next outing will be at Empty Pockets on Nov. 21 - 22 (the old Dog Gone claim). RSVP if planning to attend the outing so plans for food can be finalized. Mark Hedges closed the meeting with an anecdote in remembrance of Rick; and at 7:30 Ace made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which was seconded by Merck. The meeting ended at that time.
