

The meeting was adjourned about 3:30 p.m.



On June 12th, I had another fidget quilt workday in my big garage to create more kits from 9 a.m. to 12 noon. Thank you to Sue Aigeldinger, Susan Beinhaur, Ruth Cox, Linda Bishop, and my church friend, Dorothy, for gathering with me to create 30 fidget quilt kits. This time, we focused on making fidget quilts for men and women in memory care locations.

My next goal is to create more of the actual mats at the June 28th service workday. This involves sewing the mats like placemats. Thank you to Susan Beinhaur for helping me to cut the mats to be ready for sewing.

We are now using plastic keys, measuring spoons, and small measuring cups on the fidget quilts for children. Look for these items at summer yard sales.

Please continue to gather zippers, jean pockets and zippers, thread spools, neckties, shoelaces, cording for stringing items, and keys (my husband, Larry, is able to smooth them for safety for the adult quilts). Be creative and gather other items we might be able to use. We are staying away from buttons for safety.

Finally, I am a member of the Wild Ones Native Plants SCPA local chapter. On Sunday, July 23, we are having a garden tour event at my gardens near Landisburg. Contact me for details if you would like to attend. Other dates can be scheduled.


