
The Apostolic Faith

God planted a garden eastward in Eden, and there He put Adam, "The man He had formed," with only one commandment to observe. And the Lord God commanded the man saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt (GEN. 2:16-17). surely die. Adam disobeyed, and fell from favor with God. Lest he put forth his hand and eat of the tree of life and live forever in that rebellious state, he was driven from the garden and cherubims and a flaming sword was placed there to keep the way of the tree of life. We hear no more about the tree of life, until we locate it by the river of life in the new earth.

Because of the transgression of Adam in the garden, the seed of sin, or iniquity entered into the heart of man. David said, "Behold I was shapen in iniquity: and in sin did my mother conceive me." As a result of sin and iniquity in the heart of man whom God had created, natural death was pronounced upon him. For in the day thou eatest thereof, thou shalt surely die. Adam lived 930 years and died. He died in one of God's "Be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.' once appointed unto man to die, and after this the judgment. since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die. even so in Christ shall all be made DEATH came through Adam, but LIFE comes through Jesus Christ. The first death comes to the sinner, and also to the christian; as a result of Adam's transgression. But the bible speaks of another SECOND death for the sinner; not because of Adam's transgression, but as a result of rejecting CHRIST THE LIFE. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him

should not PERISH, but have everlasting life. (JN. 3:16). This was God's gift for the salvation of the world. In failing to accept the gift, we perish. John speaks as follows: "And this is the record, that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He that hath the Son hath life: and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life." (I JN. 5:11-12). For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. (ROM. 6:23). The penalty for sin is death; and there could be no eternal burning in hell, if Christ is our only source of ETERNAL LIFE.

In MAT. 18:3,—Jesus said, "Verily I say unto you, except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven." Children, before coming to the years of accountability; are on the same plane of life as was Adam before his fall. Sinners, having repented of their sins, honoring and accepting GOD'S gift; "The only begotten of the Father who was sent into the world to redeem sinners," have become converted, and are again on the child's plane, or, Adam's plane. Adam did not have immortal life, neither was there anything about him that was immortal. He had everlasting natural human life, and would have been living today had he not have eaten the forbidden fruit. Not only was Adam affected by his disobedience. but as a result; all have sinned and come short of the glory of God. It took the gift of God's Son to restore fallen man to that place lost through Adam. The tree of life was preserved and protected in Eden, and surely it was for a purpose. John tells us of the tree of life in the new earth. And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb. In the midst of the street of it, and on either side of the river, was there the tree of life, which bare twelve manner of fruits, and yielded her fruit every

month: and the leaves of the tre were for the healing of the nation. (REV. 22:1-2). He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the tree of life, which is in the midst of the paradise of God. (REV. 2:7). Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city. (REV. 22:14). Those living on the Adam plane will come forth at the second resurrection to the white throne judgment, eat of the tree of life. and dwell in the new earth.



Not only did GOD give His Son that we might be saved, but JESUS gave himself for the church. When Jesus speaks of the church, he refers to a class of people who are already saved. Let us now consider this class of christians for whom Jesus gave His life.

tians for whom Jesus gave His lif ST. JN. 10:10-11, — Give these thoughts: "The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep." In this reading we notice that He spoke of LIFE, and ABUNDANT LIFE. God gave HIS SON, that we might have life; But Jesus gave HIMSELF, that we might have it more abundantly. Thus we understand, comes in conversion; and "LIFE, ABUNDANT LIFE in sanctifica-We notice also that the good shepherd gave his life for the SHEEP. Jesus likens christians as sheep, and sinners as goats. In the 17th Chp. of St. JN. we find the Lord's prayer recorded. This prayer was prayed for the disciples, and all who would believe through their word. He said, I'm not praying for the world, "Sinners" but for those whom thou hast given me out of the world. For their sakes I sanctifmyself, that they also might b sanctified through the truth. The

pirit of Christ enters into man at conversion, but carnality, or the seed of sin is not taken out until sanctification. In HIM is life, "Spiritual life, regeneration, conversion, being reinstated to the But John said, Adam plane.' "But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the SONS of God, and to attain the new birth. This born again experience comes not by inheritance, nor by race; but it comes by grace, through the will of God. (ST. JN. 1:1-13. Paul tells us in 1st, THES. 4:3-4,—This is the will of God even your sanctification, that ye should abstain from fornication; that everyone of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honor. If sanctification is the will of God, and we are born of the will of God, we conclude that sanctification is the new birth.

Now let us consider the benefits of sanctification, and of the new birth. In REV. 12:6,—It speaks of the woman who fled into the wilderness, where she hath a place prepared of God, that they should ed her there a thousand two hundred and three score days. This woman represents the true church for which Jesus offered himself. Under the reign of the Anti-Christ, or during the great tribulation period preceding Christ's second coming, this sanctified church will be protected, and remain alive until his appearing. Again Paul speaks of this group in 1st THES. 4:17—Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. The dead in Christ shall rise first. The sanctified dead, and the living church, as the bride of Christ will rise to meet him in the air. The remnant of the woman's seed will be killed by the beast and false prophet.

In ACT. 26:18.—Paul was ordained a minister to preach through Jesus Christ, forgiveness of sins, AND, inheritance among them which are sanctified. As we consider the greater inheritance through sanctification, our thoughts turn to REV. 20:6,—Blessed and Holy is ne that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death



hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years. After Jesus has returned and the battle of armageddon has been fought, Christ will establish a reign of righteousness here upon the earth; during which time the devil will be bound, and the sanctified church will reign as kings and priests with him a thousand years. Let us consider a few thoughts from Paul's writings in (1 COR. 15:51-54). Behold I show you a mystery; we shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible and we shall be changed. Paul tells us, we shall not ALL sleep, "or die," but we shall ALL be changed. ALL sinners, and ALL who are merely converted, "Living on the Adam plane" will be killed. The sinner will be killed as a result of the wrath of God poured out upon the beast and his supporters, and the remnant of the woman's seed will be killed by the anti-christ, because they fail to take his mark, and witness for Jesus. Paul spoke of some who would be changed. Let us read verse 53 and 54. "For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality. So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory.

When Paul spoke of the corruptible putting on incorruption, he was referring to the blessed and

Holy, sanctified dead who were placed in the grave and saw corruption; but were brought forth at the first resurrection with an incorruptible body. When he spoke of the mortal putting on immortality, he referred to the woman, or sanctified class whom Jesus gave a place of protection in the wilderness. God will change that mortal church, to the immortal bride of Christ. Those people can truly say, "Death is swallowed up in victory.'

There is another wonderful blessing brought in reach of the human family, providing they have been born again, or cleansed by the sanctifying blood of Jesus; and that blessing is, THE GIFT OF THE HOLY GHOST. Joel prophesied of this great blessing 800 years before Christ came as the saviour of the world. But it was not until after his ascension that it was brought in reach of The apostles were commanded to wait at Jerusalem for the gift. (ACT. 1:4-5). 120 received the experience at pentecost. (ACT. 1:15). Peter declared the experience at pentecost to be the same that Joel had prophesied. (ACT. 2:16). He repeated Joel's prophesy saying the promise was to ALL. (ACT. 2:38).

Now let us consider a few present blessings, and benefits of the gift. Gives power to witness. (ACT. 1:8). Teacher, and brings things to rememberance. (JN. 14: 26). Testifies of Christ. (JN. 15: 26). Guides us, and shows us things to come. (JN. 16:13-14). The main thing we desire to stress at present is the scripture found in (EPH. 1:13-14). "In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of promise. Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchase possession, unto the praise of His glory." We have spoken of the woman, and the remnant of her seed in REV. 12th chp. 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Underestimating the Enemy

One of the most prevalent and disastrous, mistakes present-day Christians and church members are making is the underestimation of the enemy of souls. Nothing, of course, pleases the enemy more than this. From the beginning of man in Eden 'til now, Satan has cunningly persuaded man to discount and deny his power and very existence. The rapidly growing and popular religions of today cleverly explain him away, and dismiss this outmoded bogey with amusement.

Underestimating our political enemies before being forced into this long war proved a costly and dangerous mistake. During our non-vigilant complacency, our enemies were carefully preparing for the day they would strike, while their envoys lied us into a false sense of security. Needless to say, we woke up with a shock and feverishly prepared for the long battle ahead without wasting any more precious time. Such signs as "The Time is Short" and "Every minute counts" appeared in war plants.

The same is true right now regarding the unseen enemy of souls. No more timely signs than these could be posted on platforms of complacent churches today. These same conditions obtain spiritually, and the same pre-war slumber, while Satan is waging his neversleeping war on every living soul. "Graveyard peace" is the torporsatisfaction enjoyed by multitudes of church members. Like the Laodicean church, they are spiritually desolate; dead and don't know it.

Jesus warned: "Take heed that no man deceive you." Many learned men today are willing envoys of Satan, who carry out his deceiving orders with skill and cunning "logic." "Evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived." II Tim. 3:13. Jesus also warned His own disciples to "Take heed and beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and . . . Saducees" . .

Math. 16:6. Not one of us are proof against the adversary except through the appropriated blood of the Lamb.

Martin Luther's great hymn aptly says: "His craft and power are great, and armed with cruel hate: on earth is not his equal."

Peter, the rock, on which Christ built His church, wrote: "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: whom resist steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world." I Peter 5:8-9.

Many young men in this war do not like to hear about the dangers and crafty enemy technique they'll be exposed to. But to become thoroughly acquainted with every possible plan of enemy attack and surprise trickery is of paramount importance in preserving their lives. When the tests come, ignorance or non-vigilance would be fatal folly.

One of Satan's smartest tricks is to persuade or distract us into relaxing our vigilance. Failure to recognize him in any of his many guises often proves a costly lesson learned the "hard way." Paul admonished: "Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil." Ephesians 6:11. Read Hebrews 3:13, 14.

The rewards for overcoming are very great for a good reason: it means something and is not easy to "overcome," or be victorious, over satan and sin. Jesus assured us: "In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." "For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil." 1 John 3:8.

And His and our complete triumph will come in the final, eternal fulfillments foretold in Revelation 3:21.

"To Him that overcometh will

I grant to sit with me in my throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with My Father in His throne." Praise His name!

HEBREW, GREEK, AND LATIN

"Hebrew, Greek, and Latin" (John 19:20). In 487 B. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed," Isaiah 53:5. "They part my garments among them, and cast lots upon my vesture," Psa. 22:18. "For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell; neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption," Psa. 16:10. All these scriptures stand as mute evidence of the fact that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of God, for they were all fulfilled in his life, death, and resurrection. 538 years before the time of Christ, Daniel had a vision in which he was told the time of the birth of Christ. The substance of this vision in relation to the subject at hand is given in Dan. 9:25. He was told that from the order to rebuild Jerusalem until the time of the long-awaited Messiah would be seven weeks, and sixty two weeks or a total of 69 weeks. Bible students agree that the time which is referred to as a week in this scripture is not our week of seven days, but seven years. This is no violation of the Bible, but is the same as the week spoken of in Gen. 29:26-28. Several decrees were given regarding the rebuilding of Jerusalem varying in date from B. C. 536 to B. C. 444 which dates cannot be fixed definitely. The record of these commands is given in Ezra and Nehemiah. Any time within the range of the dates given above, with the addition of the sixtynine weeks, brings us very close to the time of Christ. Please note that 500 years ago America was yet undiscovered, and 400 years ago it was still uncolonized. These

prophecy which was made at a time so remote from the time of its fulfillment? It was slightly over 700 years ago that King John of England signed the Magna Charta which forms the basis of all democratic forms of government. Surely it would be impossible for anyone in his time to foretell the place of birth of someone in our day. Yet that is substantially what happened in this scripture: and we are aware that Christ was acutally born there—history records it unequivocally.

In Isaiah 7:14 we find these words: "Therefore the Lord Himself shall give you a sign; behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." This scripture foretells the manner of Christ's birth 742 years before he was born, and also that he should be called Immanuel, which means "God with us." This was fulfilled without doubt in Christ's birth. Again in Isaiah 9:6, "For unto us a child is born: unto us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, the Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace." This scripture was also fulfilled in the birth of Christ, with the exception of the phrase "and the government shall be upon his shoulder," which is yet to be fulfilled when He comes back to earth the second time, with power and great glory.

Our A Treasure &

I wonder how many of you children have a Bible all your own? Did you ever stop to think how much work has been done, so that all of us can easily own a Bible?

Once upon a time, a long, long, time ago, there was no writing or printing. Fathers and mothers told stories to their children, and sometimes a famous story teller would travel about, telling what had happened long before.

Someone invented picture writing, and the pictures were traced on many things. Clay tablets were used, or the pictures carved on stone. Then they used the skins of animals, and invented ink with which to mark on the skins.

The people of Egypt learned a simpler and easier way of writing, and made paper from a weed.

God's people also learned about writing at this time. They were called Hebrews and their language, the Hebrew language. Their writers, who were led of God to write, wrote on scrolls, or long pieces of paper fastened together. These were carefully kept and it was from these that Jesus read.

Only a very few people could read or write. These men were called scribes. The work of writing was done by hand, and the letters used were all capitals. It looked something like this GOD-ISLOVE. When a scribe was ready to write the name of God, he tried to do his best work, and even washed his pen before he began to write that name.

Over 200 years before Christ came the Hebrew people lived in other countries where Greek was the language spoken. Wise men translated the Old Testament from Hebrew to Greek.

Just before Jesus ascended into Heaven he told his disciples to "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature."

Disciples and followers of Jesus



obeyed this command, and churches grew up in many places. Parts of the Bible were translated into many languages, and finally a very good man named Jerome worked hard for years and translated the Bible into Latin. A large number of ungodly people were displeased with his work.

If you had lived in England only a few hundred years ago, you would have been unable to read your Bible, for there was no Bible written in English. Only a few very well educated persons could understand Latin. Godly men began to see the need of having the Bible in English so the common people could read it.

Some parts of the Bible were translated into English, and then a man called Wycliffe worked hard many years and finished translating the Bible from Latin to English. A copyist worked about ten months to make a single copy.

The common people received the new TREASURE CHEST gladly, but the rulers of the Church did a strange and terrible thing. They passed a law saying that no one should be allowed to read the Bible. To own one was considered a crime. Many persons were put in prison for the privilege of reading and studying the Bible.

People who could not own books read those of their wealthy neighbors. One man paid a whole

load of hay to be permitted to read from another man's Bible an hour a day for a certain number of days. A little girl learned the Ten Commandments, and some parts of the Epistles. When all books were written by hand, and paper was very expensive, only wealthy persons could own books. This made it impossible for most people to read the Bible. Many persons tried to find easier ways of making books. In the year 1450 Johann Gutenberg invented the printing press. When he took the model to the workmen who was to make the first printing press, he said, "Through this God will spread His Word." Sure enough the first book printed was the Bible, so James I, King of Engfound how to make cheaper paper.

Many years later the people felt the need of a better translation of the Bible, so James I, king of England found fifty-four men to do the work. It was seven years before the work was finished and published. This is the Bible you and I use today, 334 years later. We also have an American version to use.

The Bible, all of it, or in parts, has been translated into hundreds of languages and dialects, so that other people can have this wonderful Treasure Chest. Even the blind have not been forgotten, and a copy of our Bible can be bought

for a few cents.

Boys and girls, every time you pick up your Bible, I want you to think of the years and years of hard work it has taken for us to own a Bible. Many good men were put in prison, or even put to death, trying to improve the reading of it. Be glad for your Bible and read it often, for it is God's word given to us to take care of.

the prophecies regarding the Messiah who was to come. But they were fulfilled, and those who failed to believe on him because of his suffering are no better off for their momentary glorifying of this Jesus, since they were later offended in him. Those who had opportunity to read the scriptures but chose not to see therein the death and suffering of Christ will stand condemned for that failure.

In the face of so great a cloud of witnesses to the fact of the divinity of Jesus, is it possible for one to fail to believe on him? Would we be guilty as were the Jews of not studying the word of God from an unbiased point of view, but accept only the glory part of the gospel, refusing the cross? Jesus admonished us to 'Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life; and they are they which testify of me." John 5:39. May we begin to study the Word of God in order to see whether we have eternal life, or whether there is yet something for us to do before we are admitted into the portals of glory. Some will say, "But this is the age of grace—all we must do is believe to be saved." Perhaps true, but did you not also read about the signs following a believer? Did you not read about repentance? Did you not read one must be born again in order to see the Kingdom of God? Did you not read where He said to take up our cross daily and follow him? Many of us are looking for the promises of God, but are not willing to see the commandment that goes with it, which is the condition that must be met before we receive the promise. Many of us are so busy looking for the portals of glory, and for riches and comforts here that we never have time to look around to see whether the Lord left a cross for us to bear. It is one thing to believe on Jesus as the historical king; and it is quite another thing to believe on him as our king, our Lord, our all in all. Each one has his own cross to bear, and if we fail wilfully to see it, we are accountable, and cannot inherit the promises of God. We must each examine our own lives, to see whether we be in the faith: whether we just believe on Christ as the historical Messiah, or as King of Kings, and Lord of Lords.

You know, the great commandment is to love the Lord God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and the next is to love your fellowman as yourself. (Mark 12:28-31.) If we do these things, our service to God and to others will be a service of Love, and will accomplish something. Paul gives some light on how we may keep these command-ments, when he said, "Whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God,' Cor. 10:13. I believe we would begin to discover where we stand with God if we would consider everything we do, and see whether we do all to the glory of God.

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The Gospel in the Battle-Scarred Solomons

It is more than four hundred years since the first white man, in the person of a Spanish navigator who had voyaged out from Peru, discovered the Solomon Islands. These islands remained unseen by any other Europeans for more than two hundred years. Gradually their wild cannibal and head-hunting tribes came under various civilizing influences. Christianity was accepted by thousands of these savages of the Solomons, and today it is a mighty force throughout the group. Head-hunters' sons have carried the gospel message to the same tribes whom their fathers fought. The war cries of the heathen have given way to Christian hymns. Beautifully carved war canoes now carry families to places of worship. Instead of fierce and inhuman cannibal and headhunting expeditions, the people meet together in the worship of their Master.

The gospel has performed wonderful things. Ordained native ministers are the sons of head-hunters and cannibals. One of these has organized canoe squads that have been instrumental in rescuing nearly a hundred airmen from sea and jungle. These fine Christian people who have performed this noble rescue work were "primitive" but a few years ago. Now they are transformed, for they have found Jesus and have learned to love Him and to appreciate the purpose of His leaving the courts of glory and coming to this world.

It did not take millions of years for head-hunters to become Christians, rather but a few years, and in some cases not even a year. Their sons became Christian teachers of power and purpose, who won heathen of opposing tribes to Christ. This great work continues in the face of the greatest conflict this distracted world has yet seen. The front line of modern warfare has been carried into their midst



with incredible suddenness. Many of the deeds of love and mercy performed by these dusky-skinned Solomon Islanders during this present conflict would thrill the reader, if they could be told. Many Americans live today who would not have lived but for them.

No finer investment was ever made by the people of the United States than their support of Christian missions in the Solomon Islands. Today these battle-scarred islands have exchanged cannibalism and head-hunting for the gospel; they have surrendered their habits of smoking and betel nut chewing for Christ's message of love. The thunders of modern warfare on land and sea and in the air, which have rent their once-secluded domains, have only made them truer soldiers of the cross.

A MISSIONARY TROPHY

A Christian soldier writing to his pastor from somewhere in the South Sea Islands relates the following:

This morning while away from camp I came upon one of the most interesting pictures of my life. The natives were building a grass hut, and they had only the wood framework up. One black boy was perched on the top of the center support, singing the hymn, 'Jesus Christ Is Risen Today,' in his own native tongue. It was at first quite a shock to me, but I realized that he had learned it from a missionary. I looked up at him and I don't think I have ever seen such a look of complete happiness on any human face in my life. I called up to him and said that he was a good boy. I don't know just why I said that, but I did. He looked down at me and repeated a few times, 'Me good boy, me good boy.' He came down from his perch and began to sing again. I listened, then joined him in English. How strange it was to hear this primitive boy and myself singing praises to our God. One feels the presence of God more out here in the wilds of the world. He alone meets our needs."
