

At a Special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Cohocton, Steuben County, New York, held at the Town Hall, South Main Street, in said Town of Cohocton, on the 5th day of December, 1968, at 1:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time.

WHEREAS, numerous complaints have been received by this Board with reference to the many unsafe buildings and collapsed structures that are presently situate within the boundaries of the Town of Cohocton, all of which are in great need of repair or renovation, and

WHEREAS, such buildings and structures as they presently exist may now be or shall hereafter become dangerous or unsafe to the public, and

WHEREAS, this Board has been requested to pass an ordinance providing for the removal or repair of buildings in business, industrial and residential sections that, from any cause, may now be or shall hereafter become dangerous or unsafe to the public

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED: That pursuant to Section 130 of the Town Law of the State of New York, a public hearing on a proposed Town Ordinance to provide for the removal or repair of buildings in business, industrial and residential sections that, from any cause, may now

be or shall hereafter become dangerous or unsafe to the public  
be held on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1968, at 7:00 o'clock  
P.M, Eastern Standard Time at the Town Hall, South Main Street,  
in the Town of Cohocton, New York, and that notice of the time  
and place of such hearing describing in general terms the pro-  
posed ordinance, be published in the Journal Evening Tribune  
a newspaper circulating in said Town of Cohocton.
