

Current Needs of Students at Petals of Africa School in Kenya



Dear Friends of Petals,

Some of you replied to our last email that you would like information about the 8th grade students at Petals who will need help to go on to secondary school. There are actually 12 students in that category, but we are waiting to find out how much their parents can contribute. The three students introduced in this email are all orphans, and we are committed to paying their entire school fees.

Joy Mvavua Lucas

Joy has been invited to Asumbi Girls School, a national high school. She has been enrolled at Petals since 3rd grade. She lost her parents about 10 years ago, first her mom and then her dad, and she currently stays with a step brother. Her school fees are almost \$600, and she may need a little extra for a new uniform and supplies.

Elvis Keuye

Elvis was raised by a single mother, who passed on in 2015. He lives with an aunt and has been going to school at Petals for the last 3 years. I remember Elvis from visits to Petals. He is bright and curious and he has big plans for his future. He has been invited to enroll at Kisii School, also a national high school. Elvis's school fees are \$600.

Beverly Adhiambo Ochieng

Beverly has been at Petals since the 5th grade. That was the year after her mom passed on; she lost her dad in 2008. She currently stays with her grandmother, and she has one younger sister in 2nd grade. Beverly's highest grades were in math and science, and she has been admitted to Asumbi Girls School. Her school fees for the year are also \$600.

For those of you who may not know, many girls, especially those in rural areas, keep their heads shaved while they are in primary school.

If you can help one of these deserving students go to secondary school, please let me know. It is really important that both boys and girls go to school. Without a secondary school education, job opportunities are limited and girls can be married and/or pregnant as young as 14 or 15. School fees are paid directly to the school, so that we know the funds are used for their intended purpose.
