**Pastor's report**: Glad the 150<sup>th</sup> event went well. Sauk Valley news called for information about the event and church, so we look for that to be published. We received the transfer for Melanie Wyatt and welcomed her November 7<sup>th</sup>. Some home visits and communions have been done with more to come. I will be taking a vacation week November 22<sup>th</sup> through the 29<sup>th</sup>. Reverend Frank Lay from Mt. Morris will lead and preach. I am sure you will enjoy him. Kent and I continue to examine the microphone challenges.

**Worship**: Rededication went well. 100 adults and 14 children were reported. Advent and Christmas are on the way, and we look forward to it. Looking for more people to be trained on helping with alter guild. Christmas Eve Service will be at 4pm.

**Hospitality:** Advent calendars will be given to those individuals in nursing home. Letters & Christmas cards will be written to go along with the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary book for shut ins. Pastor will be doing the deliveries due to restrictions. Thank you, Cindy, for cleaning the Advent candle stand. Thank you for everyone helping at the 150<sup>th</sup> event.

**Education:** Children's bells were terrific at the 150<sup>th</sup> Event. We really appreciate Cheryl's patience. We look forward to their program December12<sup>th</sup>.

**Property**: Thank you everyone for cleaning up the church for the anniversary celebration. Merla will call Boss Roofing and Bowman Electric again. Awnings will be replaced in the spring. Thermostats have been adjusted in the main level of the church. The basement one remains off, please let Merla know if it needs to be turned on. Radiators will be painted in the summer. Fluorescent lights have been replaced in a few spots. We have 4 florescent- 4 feet bulbs remaining. We will hold off on buying more as they need to be specially disposed. Craig will follow up with Dale Frey on finishing the painting for the porch parsonage. Refrigerator/freezer was installed in the church basement.
