

Pastor's Study Desk Notes

4th Sunday Easter Year B



Jn 10:11-18

"I am Good Shepherd", Jesus says! In the Gospel of John, Jesus describes Himself using several different images (concepts) that are familiar to us. John includes seven titles or descriptions of who Jesus is for us. (Seven is John's favorite number!) Jesus will reveal that He is 1) the bread of life" (John 6:35), the "light of the world" (John 8:12), 3)"the gate" (John 10:7), 4) "the good shepherd" (John 10:11), 5) "the resurrection and life" (John 11:25), 6) "the way, truth, and life" (John 14:6), 7) "the true vine" (John 15:1-5). It's no surprise to me that Jesus speaks so imaginatively here about how He relates to us, because we all know how He preferred to teach with the parablestory form, too! So, Jesus is a lot of things to us, or in fact, He is everything! As St Paul will say in Colossians 3:11 "Christ is all and in all". St Paul asserts time and time again how all-encompassing Jesus is, after we have been baptized into Him. Paul comes to realize the Supreme Identity of Jesus, as everything in his life becomes 'subordinate' to living Christ! In Philippians 3:7, Paul says, "whatever gains I had before, these I have come to consider a loss because of Christ" (once we've tasted Christ, everything else fades). And in Galatians 2:20, Paul says it this way, "yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me." Some people say Paul is getting too 'mystical' on us there, but He is reflecting the practical result of accepting Christ in and through everything. Really, that is as 'down to earth' as a person can get, just like we see in Jesus' self-descriptions. Think about it: Securing bread, making fires, going in and out of doors, shepherding and vine-tending are all every day activities and all of the stuff of living each of us busy ourselves with each day! And Jesus enters into this daily business of ourselves, and we can easily access His presence in them, if we accept and are open to it.

Again, we have such a 'down to earth' God in Christ! Today's teaching about Jesus shepherding us, might be as 'down to earth' as it gets! JESUS 'lays down his life' for us. As a Shepherd, He lays down with us sheep in the field. Jesus explains HOW he does this as a shepherd, when he mentions five times that He 'lays down His life' for the sheep (verses 11, 15, 17, 18 & 18). A shepherd in the field would always be on the lookout (like a good scout) for the best 'resting areas' for sheep. And by the 'best' areas for sheep, what that means, is not only good 'water and greens' but also safe sleeping areas (Ps 23:2). If there was not a pre-fabricated sheep pen already built in a grazing field for them, a creative shepherd could fashion one, cordoning off His sheep along a stream with a cliff-hill face, and stack up some rocks to make a third wall enclosure, which leaves only one wall left to assemble, so the Shepherd's body itself would become the fourth wall or the Gate, by him laying down along that side as an entrance/exit point to keep in the sheep safely (for a wolf to harass sheep, wolf has to get through/past that shepherd).

And such self-sacrificing shepherding is reflected in Jesus' promotion of the shepherd versus the 'hired hand'. The shepherd truly loves the sheep, with no thought of any self-privilege or self benefit. The shepherd's heart is with the sheep while the hired hand is concerned with pay. The shepherd stays with and lives among his sheep while the hired hand moves from sheepfold to sheepfold and pasture to pasture always looking for more 'pay' and 'privilege', at the expense of the sheep. Jesus may be calling out the corrupt Pharisees as hired hands (see Matthew 23:13-33 for His condemnation of their greed and self-promotion), or He may be referring to the bad shepherd type, condemned back in Ezekiel 34:1-10. And Jesus goes on to describe qualities of good shepherds by saying they freely sacrifice themselves for their sheep (v11), they stay courageously with their sheep (v 12), their sheep 'listen-hear His voice' (v 16), they know Him (v 14) and there is 'unity-harmony' (v 16) among them in addition to the Father's love (v17) felt amid them. Of course, Jesus Himself perfectly embodies these welcome shepherding gifts. And how grateful we should all be that we have such a 'Good Shepherd' in Him. As I always tell our children, especially our First Communion class today, that as a sign of our gratitude for Jesus being our Good Shepherd, we should strive always to be His Good Sheep. And that is an excellent prayer meditation for us: What disposition should we reflect to be seen as being 'Good Sheep' of our Lord?
