



From Your Public Awareness Campaign (PAC) Chair

Back in April 2015, several meetings were held with Calaveras County Library Staff and Calaveras County Friends of the Library (FOTL). The object of the meetings was to determine how to improve the library system after almost ten years of reductions in services to the Calaveras County Library patrons.

The attendees determined the following three goals need to be accomplished to improve the library system:



- 1. The first goal was to raise the public awareness of the Calaveras Public Library and to show the public the value of the library system.
- 2. The second goal was to raise the Supervisor's awareness of the Calaveras Public Library system and to show the Supervisors the value of the library.

From Your Librarian

Happy Fall!

Thank you to each of you who has chosen to become a Friend of the Library in Calaveras County. Your contributions of time, money and service enable us to continue to improve the services we offer our citizens. I believe our future is bright and I am grateful for the opportunity to serve as your County Librarian.

We have many wonderful things coming in the next few months, some of which are possible through support of **the Friends of the Library**:

- We are finally upgrading our old circulation system! Our present outdated system is in danger of crashing and when I expressed my concern about this, the Friends of the Library stepped in to help by donating the money needed for the move to the new service. Thank you to each local FOTL, MVL, Inc. and the County FOTL for making this necessary step possible.
- We have a budget for new books for this year!
 Friends of the Library voted to establish a designated fund within the County's Library budget and donate \$7,250.00 for new books and materials. The Board of Supervisors voted to match this generous donation, giving us \$14,500.00 for new materials this year. Thank you Friends of the Library for your donation and for inspiring the Board of Supervisors to do the same.
- Many wonderful members of FOTL serve as volunteers in our branches, giving hundreds of hours each month county-wide. We could not exist without your help. Thank you, volunteers!
- County administration requires that a county employee be present each hour our branches are open. The county pays a branch assistant to work 18 hours in each location. Some communities want more than that. Again, the Friends of the Library stepped in and offered to pay for extra hours for these branches. We are in the process of hiring extra permanent part time staff to serve these branches. [Note: we are keeping statistics

of numbers of users each day and each hour in each branch, so we will have a clear picture of our real needs for next year.] Thank you Friends of the Library for giving us the opportunity to continue with current hours while we assess our needs. (Volunteers are still needed in every branch!)



 eBooks are available to our users through a program called OverDrive. Thank you Friends of the Library for paying for this service for us and our patrons.

Thanks also goes to the **California State Library**. This year they are providing:

- ZIP books: a service which allows our users to request a book (online on our webpage or in person at the library). If the book is available on Amazon Prime and is under \$35.00, we order it for the patron and it is sent directly to their home. When they are done, they return it to the library and we add it to the collection. This year, we have been given \$4000.00 for ZIP books.
- Link+: an interlibrary loan system which will soon be operational in California. We will have access to books in 70 library systems within California and Nevada, including some university and special libraries. This service will be free to the user.
- A scholarship: for me to attend a conference of the Association of Rural and Small Libraries in Fargo, North Dakota in October. I will attend workshops which will help us as we develop new programs and services in our library.



- One was a truck driver who found work in the Valley and;
- One is now a letter carrier in the Copper community.

The following are the 2015-2016 PAC accomplishments


✓ Organized in Summer 2015

- ✓ Created new County-wide Library Logo and printed brochures for library handouts
- Created County-wide library events Calendar to be used for distribution to newspapers and magazines
- Hired two people to support the PAC, funding provided by County FOTL
- ✓ Reorganized County FOTL member list and mailed renewal membership letter
- Reviewing County FOTL webpage and improving it
- Created County FOTL speaker bureau and trained speakers to provide information about the

- Calaveras County library system to the public
- ✓ Participated in County Fair as County-wide Library system to increase awareness of the library system
- Created Back-to-School bags for elementary and middle school students

The PAC committee is beginning its second year and it will continue to work on the three goals. It will continue its work until it is determined the goals have been completed.
