
Good of the Order was conducted and then at 2000 a motion was made to adjourn the meeting, seconded and approved.

The FRA sponsors an annual essay contest to promote the spirit of Americanism and Patriotism among our country's youth. FRA's Americanism Essay Contest is open to all students, grades 7 through 12, including those who are home schooled. Students are invited to submit a 350-word essay through an FRA member or local FRA branch before the December 1st deadline. Local winners are forwarded for competition at the regional level and regional winners compete for national prizes.

The grand national winner will receive \$5,000, with additional prizes for the top three essays in each grade category (\$2,500 for first place, \$1,500 for second place, and \$1,000 for third place). Each national winner will receive an attractive plaque citing his/her achievement, and every entrant judged at the national level receives a certificate of recognition. Additional prizes may be awarded to students winning at local and regional levels of competition.

Cyber Awareness Tips

Next month is Cyber Security Awareness Month, so this is a prefect time to give some tips to help protect yourself on-line.

Good Security Habits
There are some simple habits you can adopt that, if performed consistently, may dramatically reduce the chances that the information on your computer will be lost or corrupted.

- Improve password security.

 - Create a strong password.Use two-factor authentication, if available.
 - Use security questions properly.
 - Create unique accounts for each user per device.
- Choose secure networks.
- Keep all of your personal electronic device software current.
- Be suspicious of unexpected emails

Safeguarding Your Data

It is especially important to take extra security precautions when multiple people use your computer or when you store sensitive personal and work -related data on your computer.

- Use and maintain anti-virus software and a firewall.
- Regularly scan your computer for spyware.
- Keep software up to date.
- Evaluate your software's settings. Avoid unused software programs.
- Consider creating separate user accounts. Use passwords and encrypt sensitive files.
- Dispose of sensitive information properly.
- Follow good security habits.

Staying Safe on Social Networking Sites

The popularity of social networking sites continues to increase, especially among teenagers and young adults. The nature of these sites introduces security risks, so you should take certain precautions.

- Limit the amount of personal information you post.
- Remember that the internet is a public resource.
- Be wary of strangers.
- Evaluate your settings. Be wary of third-party applications.
- Check privacy policies
- Use and maintain anti-virus software.
