Trustees make some decisions & changes

Brothers, the Aerie Trustees have made some decisions, changes and revisions that may affect you.

Effective Monday, April 3, new food prices will go into effect. This is due to the increase in the minimum wage and increase in taxes that both have been in effect for some time.

We are also reviewing drink prices and these will change over a period of time as we review all of them and adjust them accordingly.

Another thing that will change, we think for the good, is that you may now put your food and drinks all on one bill. For instance, if you are eating in the kitchen and order a beverage from the bar, you may pay it all on one tab. The same is true if you are eating and drinking in the bar.

Another member concern has been over showing your official receipt, membership card, before being served. It is the law that everyone in the Aerie bar must have a current, up-to-date, official receipt to be served alcohol and to gamble in any way including pull tabs, dice, drawings, etc. Until we hear different from the Liquor Board, Gambling Commission and Grand Aerie, you must have your official receipt with you and show it voluntarily. Don't wait to be asked, it just slows things down. A copy of the receipt or a picture on your cell phone is not acceptable.

If you have any questions about anything that you don't understand, please come to a Trustees Meeting and we will do our best to answer your questions or address your concerns. We meet ever Wednesday at 5 p.m. upstairs in the poker room.

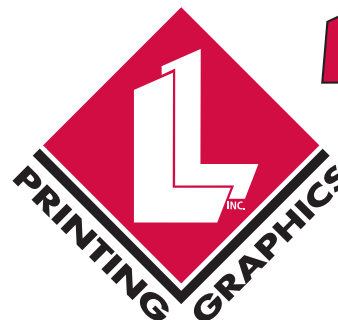
